#### **Measles Guide for EMS**

The <u>Measles Guide for EMS</u> is designed to help EMS personnel and first responders safely and effectively manage suspected or confirmed measles cases. Measles is a highly contagious viral disease that poses significant risks, particularly in emergency response settings where rapid assessment and transport are essential. Understanding the signs and symptoms, appropriate precautions, and reporting procedures is critical to protecting both patients and providers. This guide outlines key protocols to minimize transmission and ensure timely care.

## **Broselow Pediatric Emergency Rainbow Tape Recall**

The U.S. Food & Drug Administration (FDA) recall includes specific Broselow Tape versions and involves removing certain devices from where they are used. The FDA has identified this recall as the most serious type. This device may cause serious injury or death if you continue to use it. Review full information here.
