<p>The Stroke Care Committee will meet at the Portland State Office building for the 2020 meetings. The time will change from 0700-0830 to 0900-1200. Meetings are open to the public and will be available to attend via webinar.</p> <p>2020 Goals –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recommendations around improvement of stroke • Rehab component champion triage bill around acute stroke care • Review the literature around transport policy • Data review session around what is taking place • PDX Metro EMS triage group - policy have formed discussions • Bill language was worked on did not find a sponsor, what are the next steps? • What does the committee for 2020 for QI for Oregon? <p>Data Workgroup – Washington County has created a quarterly QI with review of Stroke care in the county, if the QI is protected. The group identified that they would like to review regional stroke care. A group will work with AHA to identify if this is possible with GWTC and if yes what is the exact user account that is needed. Reviewing data will support the work and recommendations to legislation for Stroke Legislation.</p> <p>Metro (Tri-county) prehospital protocol for 2020 do not have any changes.</p> <p>The committee would like to have quarterly data to review. Transportation and regionalized Stroke Care. Rehab limitation – What barriers are the rehab workers facing? The committee would like to invite the groups, through association or licensing program, to the meetings. If they are involved and participate, consider inviting them as a position on the board.</p>

<p>OHA is reviewing options to increase the vendor contract to include a more granular review of the state data. There are different options to build the benchmark reports but would need access to the raw data. The committee would like to review data quarterly.</p>

Agenda Item	<i>EMS and Trauma Systems Directors Update – Dr. David Lehrfeld</i>
<p>Shawn Baird was the recipient of the 2020 EMS Director’s award. EMS for Children has collaborated with OHSU Doernbecher to create a toolkit for parents with special needs children. This document will help caregivers understand how to treat the child. The OREMSIS Prehospital data system performance measure includes a measure for Stroke care. C6. Suspected Stroke Receiving Prehospital Stroke Assessment measures the data collected by an ePCR. The track is showing above average for our agencies. Would the state consider approving the national benchmark into the state comparison? Candace Toyama has resigned as the State EMS and Trauma System manager. The position has opened and closed. A policy option package was presented to the OHA leadership team. It includes updating prehospital regional care and would include stroke care.</p>
