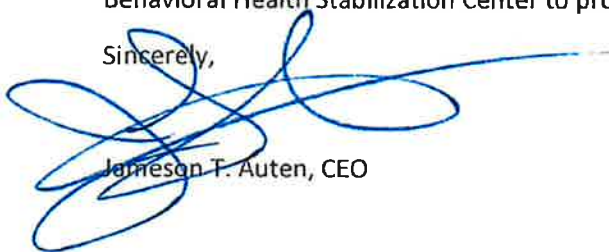
The Behavioral Health Stabilization Center is a critical initiative that will address urgent community needs. The facility will provide 24-hour urgent care for individuals experiencing acute-level behavioral health crises, with dedicated units for adult and youth behavioral health supervision, intensive substance abuse treatment, and post-acute care services. This comprehensive approach will reduce strain on emergency departments and offer life-changing support to adults and youth in need.

Additionally, Lane County has engaged in a private/public partnership with PeaceHealth to co-locate the Stabilization Center with their planned behavioral health unit, Timber Springs. Timber Springs Behavioral Health Hospital will feature a 96-bed inpatient unit providing comprehensive services for adolescent, adult, and geriatric patients, as well as intensive outpatient treatment. These co-located facilities will provide convenient access to individuals experiencing a behavioral health emergency.

This funding will allow the community to expedite the implementation of this critical public service, addressing the growing crises of homelessness, addiction, and mental health challenges.

Please give this request full and fair consideration, which will enable the Lane County Behavioral Health Stabilization Center to provide vital services to our community.
