2026-2027 work plan and budget proposal

Background

- Non-competitive grant through Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
- Issued to all states and territories to address state determined public health priorities
- Work plan tied to Healthy People 2030 Objectives
 - Oregon uses this Block Grant for infrastructure and in the current year tied to
 - PHI-R04: Increase the proportion of states that have developed a health improvement plan, and
PHI-R08: Explore financing of public health infrastructure, including the core/foundational capabilities in health departments.
- Portion of funding allocation for rape prevention and victim services
 - Oregon Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Violence
PHI-D05: Rape Prevention

Purpose

The PHHS Block Grant Program allows states, territories, and tribes to:

- Address emerging health issues and gaps.
- Decrease premature death and disability.
- Achieve health equity by addressing social determinants of health.
- Support local programs to achieve healthy communities.
- Establish data and surveillance systems to monitor health status.

Health objectives for State Health Improvement Plan

- Healthy People 2030: PHI-R04: Increase the proportion of states that have developed a health improvement plan
- Oregon's health objective: By 2030, demonstrate improvements in key health indicators through successful implementation of Oregon's 2025-29 State Health Improvement Plan.



2023-2024 Previous Budget

- **Mini grants - 12 Organizations**
 - Offered to LPHAs and CBOs to advance SHIP strategies, supported their local CHIPs, and partnered with neighbor agencies
- **HTO Seeds – 18 CBOs**
 - The Seeds mini grant offered up to \$4,000 to CBOs to find creative ways to talk about HTO and how their work supported health equity
- **PartnerSHIP Steering Committee**
 - Stipend for members and meeting activities - Ex. In person gatherings
- **CHW scholarship – First Cohort 20 students**
 - This grant provided funds to Benton LPHA to provide CHW training to build in components that supported the implementation of Oregon’s SHIP



2025-2026 Current Budget

- **CHW scholarship** – Second and Third Cohort 46 students
 - This grant continue to provide funds to Benton LPHA to provide CHW training to build in components that supports the implementation of Oregon’s SHIP and to conduct post-training evaluation at 6 and 12 months.
- **SHIP Collaborative**
 - Stipend for members and to fund meeting activities - Ex. In person gatherings
- **External Communications contract**
 - SHIP Communication plan
 - SHIP Communication materials



2026-2027 Budget proposal

Allocate funds to:

- Support the implementation of the SHIP Objectives. Ex: Develop a universal vaccine purchasing model
- Continue to offering stipend to SHIP Collaborative members and to fund meetings activities
- Continue the contract with Benton LPHA to provide CHW scholarships statewide
- Fund an external communication contract to enhance the SHIP and public health modernization communication efforts

Health objectives for public health modernization

Healthy People 2030: PHI-R08: Explore financing of public health infrastructure, including the core/foundational capabilities in health departments.


Oregon's health objective: By 2030, demonstrate improved health outcomes through a sustainably financed, community-centered and accountable public health system, as defined through public health accountability metrics.

2025-26 current budget and work plan

- PHAB retreat and other costs
- Support to CLHO
- Public health system improvements
- Required reporting and legislative deliverables
- PH Modernization Chats
- Partner stories
- Measles community-specific outreach

2026-2027 budget and workplan proposal

- Support robust collaboration, decision-making and performance by OHA and LPHAs
 - Funding to CLHO
 - Workforce reporting
 - Federal funding trainings
- Support PHAB to operate at its highest level to provide direction for the governmental public health system
 - In person meetings
 - Trainings or other Board supports
- Demonstrate system-wide impact of a modern public health system
 - Communications, with focus on telling the stories of public health
- Invest in community data and data equity
 - Align with short term outcomes in PHAB Strategic Data Plan
 - Make data available to partners and communities
 - Explore and conduct data equity trainings (for partners, PHAB, OHA and LPHA staff working on accountability metrics etc)



Health objectives for sexual violence prevention

- Healthy People 2030: PHI-D05 Reduce contact sexual violence by anyone across the lifespan
- Oregon's health objective: By 2030, track and demonstrate progress toward key health indicators for bullying and economic inequality
