## TOBACCO-FREE STATE OF OREGON PROPERTIES

To help Oregon become one of the healthiest states, Oregon Gov. John Kitzhaber has directed all State of Oregon properties to begin going tobacco free in January 2013. Tobacco use will not be allowed on the grounds or campuses of state property including: Doorways—Parking lots—Porches—Outdoor foyers

## **Tobacco facts and resources**

- Tobacco use is the No. 1 cause of preventable deaths in Oregon.
- Almost 7,000 Oregonians die every year from tobacco use and an additional 750 nonsmokers die every year from the effects of secondhand smoke.
- Tobacco use cost Oregon nearly \$2.4 billion in 2009.

## If you see an employee, client or visitor using tobacco on campus, use these tips:

- Be polite and friendly.
- Assume the person isn't aware of the policy.
- Explain tobacco use is not permitted on the State of Oregon campus.
- Offer an Oregon Tobacco Quit Line card.
- Remind the person of links between tobacco use and health risks.
- Empathize with the person's situation.
- Make a decision based on the situation you may not want to insist, but offer an Oregon Tobacco Quit Line card.
