




ACCESS TO CARE FOR MEDICAID MEMBERS

The 2015 Physicians Workforce Survey results show that the majority (87.9%) of responding physicians in Oregon are accepting NEW Medicaid patients.


In 2015, 9 out of 10 physicians in Oregon said yes to accepting NEW Medicaid clients.

...and 9 out of 10 currently have Medicaid clients under their care.




Physicians with an in-state practice address, MD or DO with an active license with no restrictions, in good standing.




Access to mental health and substance use disorder services continue to be the most difficult service type for Medicaid clients to be referred to.


In 2015, only 1.5 in 5 physicians said they were 'usually' or 'always' able to refer Medicaid clients to outpatient mental health services.

...and 1 in 5 said they were 'usually' or 'always' able to refer Medicaid clients to outpatient substance use disorder services.



Physicians were asked 'how often are you able to obtain services for Medicaid patients when you think it is medically necessary'? Respondents who answered 'always' or 'usually'.
