What's a COVID-19 Community Level?

- A new tool to help communities decide what prevention measures to take based on the latest data
- Every community in the United States are classified as:

Low

on healthcare system, low levels of severe illness

Medium

Some impact on healthcare system, more people with severe illness

High


High potential for healthcare system strain; high level of severe illness



What are COVID-19 treatments?



- They stop the virus from multiplying
- Need to start them within5 days of getting sick



Monoclonal Antibodies

- Given by vein
- They stop spread of virus in your body
- Need to start within7 days of getting sick

Both reduce risk of hospitalization and death





Summary of Treatments



Mild-to-moderate symptoms




- Oral antivirals
 - Paxlovid
 - Lagevrio (molnupiravir)
- Injectables (by vein)
 - Bebtelovimab
 - Remdesivir





Who Should get Treatment

Treatments are for:



A healthcare provider will prescribe based on your personal medical history

How to Get Treatment

Locators

	Test to Treat (T2T) Locator	COVID-19 Treatment Locator
What is it?	Shows sites where you can get tested (or bring a positive at home test), get an oral antiviral prescription, fill the prescription or send it to a nearby pharmacy, all in one visit	Shows public locations near you that have oral antivirals and monoclonal antibodies
Who is it intended for?	Community and Providers	NOTE: Communities can access, but only providers can call locations to verify supplies and services available


How to Get Treatment

- Many pharmacists can now prescribe oral antiviral Paxlovid
- Call your local pharmacy to see if they participate
- Ask what documentation they need for you to be seen
- Not all patients are eligible to receive prescriptions directly from a pharmacist

Oregon Health Plan

What is Oregon Health Plan (OHP)?

- Oregon's Medicaid Program
 - OHP Plus
 - OHP Plus Supplemental
 - OHP with Limited Drug
- Covers health services for children, teens, and adults including:
 - Check-ups
 - Vaccinations
 - Mental health
 - Glasses
 - o Tooth fillings & more!







Healthier Oregon

Background

- In 2021, Oregon expanded Cover All Kids to all children under 19 regardless of immigration status
- More adults were made eligible for full Oregon Health Plan (OHP) and other medical assistance benefits regardless of immigration status

Grant Program

- 20+ grantees will provide help and support to Healthier Oregon members
- All our grantee partners will be trained as Community Health Workers (CHWs) or given continuing education credits if they are already a CHW
- Grantee webpage coming soon!



Healthier Oregon

What to Expect

People 19-25 or 55 and older who were enrolled in Citizenship Waived Medical (CWM), also known as emergency Medicaid, automatically moved to Healthier Oregon on July 1, 2022.

People 19-25 or 55 and older who weren't eligible for full OHP because of their immigration status are able to enroll in Healthier Oregon as of July 1, 2022, by <u>applying for OHP</u>.







Healthier Oregon

What to Expect

People who are 26-54 years old who don't qualify for full OHP because of their immigration status will still be eligible for CWM or CWM Plus coverage.

- CWM covers emergency care, like what you get in a hospital
 - It also covers a few other services like reproductive health and was recently expanded to include more emergency services like out-patient dialysis.
- **CWM Plus** covers full OHP benefits during pregnancy and for 60 days after the pregnancy ends.


CWM members may also be eligible for low-cost coverage through the Oregon Health Insurance Marketplace.






Get vaccinated as soon as possible




Wash your hands






Keep a safe distance
