REAL-D Interface Enhancements

On the REAL-D Language tab:

- 1 A much more extensive language list has been added for questions **What language or languages do you use at home?**, **In what language do you want us to communicate in person, on the phone, or virtually with you?**, and **In what language do you want us to write to you?**.
- 2 To search for a language, start typing in the language in the search bar, the language list will automatically start filtering based on what you have typed in.
- 3 The answer options **Don't know** and **Don't want to answer** have been added to all three questions.
- 4 You can clear your answers by clicking on the **Clear** button.
- 5 The question **What language or languages do you use at home?** is now a multi-select option.

- The answer option **Self-Reported RedCap Interview** has been updated to **REDCap Survey Imported**.
- The **Reason not interviewed** question will always be seen even if **Interviewed** is **Yes**.

The case definitions for **Confirmed**, **Suspect**, and **Presumptive** in Opera have been updated to match.

- Confirmed:** A confirmed case is someone who tests positive using a laboratory-based FDA Emergency Use Authorized (EUA) diagnostic test. Any positive result from a laboratory-based RT-PCR, other NAAT, or antigen platform developed under an FDA EUA, even if conducted as asymptomatic screening, is considered a positive result. A follow-up test which is negative does not negate the first positive test. If a laboratory report has not been received, but a confirmatory laboratory result has been reported verbally by a healthcare provider or by an electronic case report (eCR) that clearly identifies a confirmatory laboratory result, the case will be considered confirmed.
- Suspect:** A suspect case is a person with:
 - New onset of symptoms consistent with COVID-19, including fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrheaAND
 - No more likely alternative diagnosis**NOTE:** This includes people who had close contact with a presumptive case and have an acute illness featuring at least two of the following: shortness of breath, cough, fever, new loss of smell or taste, radiographic evidence of viral pneumonia.
OR
- Presumptive:** A presumptive case is a person without a positive laboratory-based COVID-19 RT-PCR, NAAT, or antigen test result, with:
 - An acute illness featuring at least two of the following: shortness of breath, cough, fever, new loss of smell or taste, radiographic evidence of viral pneumonia;AND
 - No more likely alternative diagnosis;AND
 - Within the 14 days before illness onset: Had close contact with a confirmed case OR Lived in the same household or congregate setting as a confirmed case OR Is identified as having been exposed in an outbreak.OR
 - A COVID-19-specific ICD-10 code listed as a primary or contributing cause of death on a death certificate.OR
 - A person with a positive test result from an at-home test kit who has at least one of the
