## *Important Information*

### **Your name was not chosen to receive an OHP Standard application**

Last winter, your name was added to the reservation list for Oregon Health Plan (OHP) Standard.

Unfortunately, OHP Standard did not have enough open spaces to let everyone on the list apply. So, the Department of Human Services (DHS) used a computer to randomly choose names from the list. DHS only mailed applications to people whose names were chosen by the computer.

The computer chose 30,000 names from the 91,000 people on the list. DHS is sending you this letter because your name was not chosen.

OHP Standard is now full, and names are no longer being drawn from the list. See below for a list of other health care resources.
