Re: NDC reporting requirements effective Jan. 1, 2011

Starting Jan. 1, 2011, the Division of Medical Assistance Programs (DMAP) will require all contracted managed care plans to include National Drug Code (NDC) information whenever they report encounters for physician-administered (“J-code”) procedures.

Starting July 1, encounters for physician-administered drugs that do not contain NDC information will deny for correction (pend).
