

Home Stretch: Securing Investments





Investing in Supply Solutions

\$1 billion in Bond Funding:

- •\$616 million in Article XI-Q bonds for LIFT Rental* (POP 105, General Obligation Bonds)
- •\$130 million in Article XI-Q bonds to develop permanent supportive homes (PSH) (POP 104, General Obligation Bonds)
- •\$154 million in Article XI-Q bonds for LIFT Homeownership* (POP 105, General Obligation Bonds)
- •\$100 million in lottery bonds for preservation of affordable homes, both rental homes and manufactured home parks (POP 107, Lottery Bonds)

*pending applications received, funds may shift from LIFT Homeownership to LIFT Rental

\$18.7 million in General Fund:

- •\$9.7 million for early-stage, predevelopment costs for affordable housing developments
- •\$5 million to ensure LIFT Homeownership can reach rural communities (POP 109)
- \$4 million to establish a PSH Risk Mitigation Fund to stabilize operating costs and support the longevity of PSH developments (POP 090)



Homelessness Response & Prevention

\$111.2 million to maintain homelessness response efforts (from early session package):

- •\$45.8 million to maintain shelter operations in the state created by the Early Session Housing Package
- •\$2.3 million for outreach positions to maintain staffing for homeless outreach to support access to shelter
- •\$39.7 million investment in long-term rent assistance for those households rehoused through the Early Session Housing Package
- •\$17.5 million to maintain unit access for people rehoused through the Early Session Housing Package (e.g., services and block leasing)
- •\$5.9 million that will expand OHCS capacity to support homelessness response

\$34.6 million to maintain homelessness response efforts (in local communities and from previous biennia):

- \$24.1 million to maintain operations for Oregon's existing navigation centers, shelters and Project Turnkey sites
- \$10.5 million to address gaps in local government homelessness response efforts given the expiration of onetime federal COVID response resources

\$104.5 million to expand on emergency response efforts into 2023-25:

- \$48.9 million to re-house an additional 950 households statewide, with 25% of resources set aside for culturally responsive organizations
- \$44.6 million to prevent 9,500 evictions statewide, with 25% of resources set aside for culturally responsive organizations
- •\$5 million for the nine sovereign tribes for homeless services (POP 106)
- \$2 million to improve utilization of the Homeless Management information System (HMIS)



Homeownership, Asset Building, & Improving Program Access

\$14.3 million* to expand homeownership opportunities and keep homeowners in their homes:

- •\$11.8 million for down payment assistance for homebuyers tied to OHCS lending products (POP 116)
- •\$2.5 million to replace older or unsafe manufactured homes, preserving an essential part of Oregon's affordable homeownership housing stock (POP 108)

*investments in homeownership are included in previous slide on supply solutions \$5 million to support asset building for low-income Oregonians: The Individual Development Account (IDA) Initiative is a matched savings program with a proven track record of creating financially stable households and advancing Oregonians' financial goals. Additional investments in POP 117 will support savers in purchasing a home in response to increasing home process.

\$9 million to improving program access:
Investments in POP 103 are needed across the state to improve access to housing resources.

- •\$7.3 million to provide capacity building and technical assistance to Oregon's community-based organizations
- •\$1.7 million to improve language access for OHCS programs



Partner Agency Investments

\$16 million in Crime Victim and Survivor
Services Division (CVSSD) grant funding:
Investments to provide resources through the
Department of Justice (DOJ) to Tribal, culturally
specific, and community-based programs that help
survivors obtain or maintain safe and stable housing as
they are seeking safety from violence

- •\$10 million for HB 2933 to continue current funding for the Oregon Domestic and Sexual Violence Services Fund for emergency shelter and safety planning and advocacy services
- •\$6 million for HB 3018 for the Survivor Housing Funds for housing needs, including homelessness prevention, safe emergency housing, and rehousing assistance

- **\$6.7 million** investment in the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD):
- •\$5.4 million for HB 3414 to establish the Housing Accountability and Production Office within the Department of Land Conservation and the Department of Consumer and Business Services to support local compliance with state housing laws
- •\$1.25 million for <u>SB 847</u> to expand the opportunity for middle housing to smaller cities

HOUSING STABILIZATION: WAYS & MEANS

Housing Stabilization and Homelessness

- <u>HB 2879</u> -1 amendments allocate \$5M to ODHS for nonprofits providing affordable housing support to low-income college students. House Housing WS 4/4
- <u>HB 3209</u> \$10M to OHCS to establish an veterans emergency housing program. House Vets & Emerg. Management WS 4/4
- SB 918 Establishes Oregon Housing Justice Program at OHCS, allocates \$35.5M to Urban League of Portland, Oregon Worker Relief Coalition, IRCO and Community Action Agencies (CAAs), and allows OHCS to compensate Oregonians with lived experience of homelessness for expertise & guidance. Senate Housing WS 4/3
- <u>SB 600</u> Allocates \$4.98M to Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to distribute to Oregon Office for Comm. Dispute Resolution at University of Oregon for mediation services. Senate Ed. WS 4/4
- SB 496 Allows EHA funds to be used to provide certain care and service to pets of unhoused Oregonians. Senate Housing WS 2/8



HOUSING STABILIZATION: WAYS & MEANS

Energy

- <u>HB 3459</u> -1 amendments allocate \$5M per calendar year for Oregon Energy Assistance Program (OEAP). House Climate & Energy WS 3/29
- <u>HB 3056</u> Technical fixes to Residential Heat Pump Program at ODHS & Cooling Resource website at OHCS. House Climate, Energy & Environment WS 3/13
- <u>HB 3166</u> Requires State Department of Energy, in consultation with OHCS, to establish whole-home energy savings program and high-efficiency electric home rebate program, or "one stop shop". House Climate, Energy & Environment WS 3/15
- <u>HB 3125</u> Establishes state water & sewer assistance program (similar to LIHWA). House Ag, Land Use, Natural Resources and Water WS 3/14
- SB 868 Sets state heat pump goals, requires certain state agencies, including OHCS, to consider actions to aid in achieving greenhouse gas emission reduction goals when carrying out "designated state agency programs" (Designated Programs) that relate to promotion, implementation, incentivization, or regulation of energy efficiency in buildings. HOUSING STABILIZATION: Rules and Joint Tax

Rules

- <u>HB 3503</u> Repeals the state prohibition on a local government's ability to impose rent control limits. House Housing WS 4/4
- <u>HB 2892</u> Authorizes granting state agency to prequalify nonprofit organization to receive block grants for purpose of providing goods and services in areas of critical need. House Housing WS 3/30

Joint Tax

- HB 3032 Tax deduction for rent received for a room in taxpayer's home. House Housing WS 2/7
- <u>HB 2092</u> Extends sunset provisions for various tax credits, including IDA Tax Credit. House Revenue WS 2/28, Joint Tax Expenditures PH 3/31





HOUSING STABILIZATION: Policy Committees & Floor

Awaiting Floor Vote

- <u>HB 2680</u> Requires landlord to refund screening charge within 14 days if the landlord fills the unit before screening applicant or hasn't screened applicant. House Housing WS 4/4, House Floor 4/18 (38-20-2), Senate Housing WS 5/8 (4-0-1)
- <u>HB 3417</u> GOVERNOR'S BILL. Expands eligibility for Housing Choice Landlord Guarantee Program to landlords participating in emergency response rehousing efforts. House Floor 4/12 (51-7-2), Senate Housing WS 5/8 (4-0-1)
- <u>SB 611</u> Modifies allowable rent increase amounts, increases amount owed to tenant upon receipt of no-cause eviction. Senate Housing WS 4/3, Senate Rules WS 5/8 (3-1-1), Awaiting Senate Second & Third Reading

Policy Committees

• <u>SB 1069</u> – Allows electronic delivery of written notice to landlord or tenant & return of rent or security deposit via electronic means. Senate Floor 4/13 (28-0-2-0), House Housing PH 4/27, WS 5/11





HOUSING STABILIZATION: Passed/Awaiting Signature

• <u>SB 893</u> – OHCS BILL. Defines next steps for HB 2100 Taskforce recommendations, statutory authority clarifications, and grant/contract streamlining. Senate Floor 4/11 (25-4-1), House Housing PH 4/20, WS 4/27 (unanimous vote), House Floor 5/9 (45-13-2)





HOMEOWNERSHIP

Ways and Means

- HB 2983 Funding for DLCD and OHCS related to Manufactured Home Park development and acquisition. House Housing WS 2/21
- HB 3487 Directs OHCS to create a financial education curriculum for new homebuyers.

HOMEOWNERSHIP

Senate Committees

- <u>HB 3151</u> Manufactured Housing policy bill, including Dispute Resolution Advisory Committee extension. Senate Floor 3/22 (35-21-4), Senate Housing PH 4/12, WS 5/8
- <u>SB 976</u> Disallows, for purposes of personal income tax, mortgage interest deduction for residence other than taxpayer's principal residence. Phases out allowable deduction for interest for principal residence based upon income. Senate Finance and Revenue PH 4/19

Joint Tax

- <u>HB 3010</u> Limits the amount allow for the mortgage interest deduction, directs increase revenue to first time homeownership programs.
- HB 2465 Expands the eligibility for Oregon Affordable Housing Tax Credits (OAHTC) to Limited Equity Co-Ops. PH 4/7

Passed



 SB 702 - Allows Appraiser Certification and Licensure Board to require training on implicit bias and state and federal fair housing laws for real estate appraisers. Senate Floor (24-6-0-0), House Floor (40-20-0-0)



DISASTER RECOVERY & RESILIENCE

Ways and Means

 HB 3215 – Expands OHCS construction authority to allow for direct contracting as it pertains to disaster recovery and creates a new account related to disaster recovery funding. House Housing WS 3/21

House Revenue

• <u>SB 1012</u> – Freezes assessed value for homes destroyed in the 2020 Labor Day Wildfires. Senate Floor 4/12 (29-0-1-0), House Revenue PH 5/4

Awaiting Senate Floor Vote

• <u>HB 3462</u> —Provides that, if OEM, ODHS, or OHCS provide temporary housing to displaced individuals in response to emergency, that the housing is safe and provided in compliance with state and federal laws relating to discrimination. And that when federal disaster resources are available resources OEM, ODHS or OHCS may provide similar or equivalent resources to community members who are ineligible to receive federal resources due to immigration status, subject to availability of funds. House Floor 4/14 (35-8-17-0), Senate Housing PH 5/1, WS 5/8





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
