Oregon Housing and Community Services



Snapshot: Early Session Housing Package Investments

Answering Governor Tina Kotek's call, the Oregon Legislature made a necessary <u>down payment</u> to address Oregon's housing crisis with the over \$215 million Early Session Housing Package.

\$180.38 million Homelessness Response and Prevention

- **\$127.9 million** to invest in Executive Order 2023-02 emergency response:
 - \$85.2 million to add 600 low-barrier shelter beds statewide, hire more housing navigators to help unsheltered Oregonians, rehouse at least 1,200 unsheltered households, support wrap-around services provided by culturally specific agencies, and support local communities for sanitation services needs
 - **\$33.6 million** to prevent 8,750 households from becoming homeless by funding rent assistance and other eviction prevention services
 - **\$5 million** in emergency response funds for Tribal members living in emergency areas
 - **\$4.1 million** to support the Emergency Order response efforts at OHCS and the Office of Emergency Management, including planning for a state long-term rental assistance program
- **\$27.38 million** in homeless services response resources for the Rural Oregon Continuum of Care region as well as OHCS administrative costs to support the region
- **\$19.9 million** to support services for youth experiencing homelessness through the *Oregon Department of Human Services*
- \$5.2 million in Emergency Housing Assistance funds dedicated to youth

\$36.79 million Innovative Supply Solutions

- **\$20.2 million** to support modular housing facilities
- **\$7.79 million** was invested in the Early Session Package to support the implementation of the Oregon Housing Needs Analysis at OHCS, *Department of Administrative Services, and the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD),* including grants and technical assistance resources for local governments through *DLCD*
- **\$5 million** was invested in the Early Session Package for Agricultural Worker Housing grant program to modify on-farm housing through the *Department of Agriculture*
- **\$3.8 million** was invested in the Early Session Package for predevelopment for moderate-income housing through the Oregon Facilities Authority supported by the *Oregon State Treasury*
