#### **Overall Progress Narrative:**

In Q1 2025, staff continued to implement the PIER, IHA and HARP programs, and received policy approvals for the Housing Recovery Services (HRS), Housing Support Services (HSS), Legal Services and Resilience Planning Programs. Staff continue to work with county partners and other designees who will administer the Affordable Housing Development program. We have been conducting kickoff meetings and regular technical assistance check-ins with partners for Affordable Housing Development and Housing Recovery Services. Online toolkits for AHD and HRS have been developed to provide partners with ongoing technical assistance resources as they begin implementation. Major milestones in Q1 include:

- HUD approval of the Substantial Action Plan Amendment #2, which expanded eligible uses of the AHD program, re-allocated funding between programs The Dapprover of the Substantial Action Frank Amendment #2, which expanded eligible uses of the Arib program, re-attocated funding between probased on revised needs and included the addition of a reimbursement pathway.
   The Intermediate Housing Program opened Phase 2, increasing the number of eligible applicants.
   RFP for an Architecture and Engineering (A&E) firm was successfully completed. OHCS DRR negotiated and executedA&E consortium contract.
   A&E consortium worked with OHCS staff to design and approve workflow processes for larger program supports andindividual site-specific work.

With approval of the SAPA in January 2025, HSS was formally established. HSS consists of three distinct, but related programs, including Intermediate Housing Assistance (IHA), Down Payment Assistance (DPA) and Housing Counseling (HC). During Q1, the four (4) IHA partners rolled households over from ERA2 funded programming to the IHA program. More than 200 households were transferred from ERA2 to IHA and received rent and utility support during the reporting period. IHA partners continued to participate in trainings and scheduled technical support meetings. During Q1, OHCS continued to design and develop the DPA and HC portions of HSS. OHCS developed Requests for Applications (RFAs) to identify subrecipients for both the DPA and HC programs. The RFAs were published during Q1 and subrecipients will be selected and trained during Q2.

With approval of the Substantial Action Plan Amendment by HUD in January 2025, the Affordable Housing Development (AHD) program policy and guidelines were completed and steps taken to finalize agreements with implementing partners. Seven (7) regional/local organizations were identified to implement the AHD program in their respective jurisdictions. OHCS worked closely with each selected partner on their general development plans and budgets. 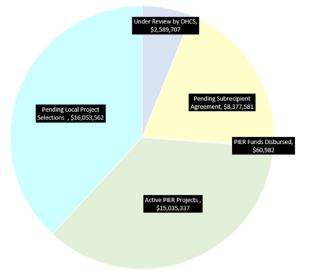

- Environmental Reviews were completed for one and initiated for three infrastructure projects.
- The Douglas County PIER Project Selection Committee will selected an alternate project from the City of Oakland for CDBG-DR funding and OHCS initiated review of the project description.
- OHCS continues to provide technical assistance for 15 selected PIER Projects with weekly check-ins with the seven active subrecipients.
- The activity delivery budget was finalized and a subrecipient agreement with Lane County to deliver six projects (1 Economic Revitalization, 5 Infrastructure) was initiated.
- The Jackson County PIER Project Advisory Committee began meeting bi-weekly on January 29, 2025 and accepted thirteen project proposals from community organizations, eight project proposals were eligible for PIER funding. Final project selections will take place at a public hearing in Q2.
- The Marion/Linn Selection Committee continues to work with OHCS to leverage PIER funding with other funding sources, including AHD, to support the North Santiam Sewer Project with Linn County's PIER allocation. The PIER Project Selection Committee will convene in Q2 to consider project proposals for Marion County's PIER allocation.
- The Clackamas County PIER Project Selection Committee began meeting bi-weekly on January 30, 2025. The committee accepted four project proposals from local organizations which were all eligible for PIER funding. Final project selections will take place at a public hearing in Q2.
- Three active projects in Jackson County have received disbursements, first draw requests for all other active projects are anticipated in early Q2.
- A public dashboard with program statistics and PIER was published, a quarterly PIER newsletter began circulation, and. a new web page for PIER was published including a page for public notices.
