

Manufactured Home Replacement Wildfire Recovery Program





Wildfire Recovery Program - Jackson County

Over 1,700 manufactured homes were destroyed in Jackson County during the 2020 wildfires. In response, the state launched a program to help those Oregonians who lost their homes to replace them. Qualified Housing Counselors at the Center for Community Resilience at ACCESS can help wildfire survivors evaluate how much it will cost to replace their homes and identify potential ways to pay for them.

Evaluating Costs

There is no cost to work with a Housing Counselor. However, there are other costs to consider when purchasing a new home. Among them are:

- The cost to deliver a new home to a manufactured home park.
- The cost to place a home in the park while following the owner's requirements.

How Is It Funded?

This program provides funding help through a 10-year forgivable loan, which means survivors will not have to pay it back. Loans are available for up to \$35,000 for a single-wide and \$45,000 for a double-wide or larger.

Your Housing Counselor also will work with you to find other funding sources to help meet your needs.
