Jackson County housing opportunities

At the request of the state, FEMA activated a federal program offering 2020 wildfire survivors the opportunity to purchase their currently occupied trailer. The Transportable Temporary Housing Units (TTHU) Sales Program gives survivors currently living in these trailers the option to purchase them at a reasonable price ("adjusted market value").

Need help understanding your housing options?

You should know there are additional options available - along with low and no-cost resources to help you understand which decision is right for you and your family or help you find an affordable place to live.

ACCESS Housing Navigators have the latest information on rentals, mobile home parks, and the kinds of financial assistance you may need to get into your next home. They may even be able to help you pay deposits, a portion of your rent and other costs related to your move.

If your current FEMA trailer works well for you and your family, financial assistance may be available. Working hand-in-hand with your FEMA coordinator, your ACCESS housing navigator can assess your financial situation and identify loans or grants that could help you. For example,

- Loans and down payments to help you buy a new manufactured home
- Moving expenses, utility hook-ups, deposits, and possibly even the relocation of your current trailer
- Payment of a portion of your rent (which would include space rent in a mobile home park) for several months until you get back on your feet

The kinds of assistance you may get depends on your income and other factors. Your housing navigator will help you sort through the available options.
