What are COVID-19 Treatments?

- **Monoclonal Antibodies (Evusheld, Bebtelovimab)**
 - **They work by stopping spread of virus in your body**
 - **They are given by vein**
- **Antivirals (Paxlovid, Lagevrio (Molnupiravir))**
 - **They are taken by mouth**
 - **Need to start them within 5 days of getting sick**
- **Both reduce risk of hospitalization and death**

Who can get treatment?

- Treatments are for ill people who have tested positive for COVID-19, and are high risk for severe illness
- Ask for "COVID treatments" to see if you are eligible when you see a healthcare provider
 - Use our resources to help have a conversation with providers
- OHA is committed to equitable distribution of these medications

How to get treatment

- Contact your healthcare provider as soon as you develop symptoms

How to get treatment

- **Test to Treat Program:** Participating sites will test (or accept a positive at-home test), prescribe antivirals, and give you the medication all in one visit. **You do not need a healthcare provider to get care at a Test to Treat site because you will see a healthcare provider.**
- **Locations to fill a prescription:** Have a healthcare provider send a prescription to a participating pharmacy. **You need a healthcare provider to write a prescription for you.**
- *Most Oregon hospitals have medications, if they request from OHA

How to get treatment

- **Test to Treat Locator:** <https://covid-19-test-to-treat-locator-dhhs.hub.arcgis.com/>
 - **How it Works:**
 - Enter address, city or zip code
 - Search within a certain distance from location (in miles)
 - Search locations with testing, medical visits, and medication
 - Search locations to fill a prescription only

The site also includes a map for easy search and navigation
