

Oregon Manufactured Home Park Directory

An Overview




Figure 1: Map Interface (default extent and layers)

The [Oregon Manufactured Home Parks Directory Map](#) is a web application that shows the locations of all mobile/manufactured home parks reported to Oregon Housing and Community Services. Other layers display demographic and housing information from the American Community Survey (ACS) five-year estimates, as well as markers for OHCS-supported park preservation projects since 2006, and the service areas of numerous energy utility providers. The tools and icons marked on the map interface as shown in Figure 1 will help you to navigate the map and set your display preferences. Given below are the nine items that are marked on the map interface in Figure 1.

Map Tools

1. **Search Box** – Allows you to search for any address (or city, county, etc.)
2. **Layers List** – When clicked, displays a list of map layers with checkboxes to turn them on or off
3. **Legend** – Deciphers symbols and colors of the map layers
4. **Information** – Provides summary details about the map, as well as data sources, disclaimers, and links to the Data Dictionary (and this Guide)
5. **Attribute Table** – Displays full data tables for layers, including options to filter by attributes and download to CSV format
6. **Basemap Gallery** – Choose between different basemaps for layers to appear on
7. **Zoom Tools** – Zooms view in or out on the map
8. **Home Button** – Returns to the default extent (view frame/zoom level) of the map
9. **Scalebar and Coordinates** – Provides reference for the distances shown at current zoom level, and the coordinates of the current mouse position

Toggle and Explore Layers

When a layer’s box is checked within the Layers List (item #2 in Figure 1), its data will be shown and can then be clicked on within the map. Clicking on any mapped area will bring up a pop-up window with all activated layers’ details shown, as they apply to the point clicked. For example, clicking on a manufactured home park (red dot or circle) will result in a window displaying the information for that park, as well as the ACS data for the Census tract in which the park lies (plus whichever other layers apply to that spot and are turned on).

Layers

1. **Preservation Projects Since 2006** – Park locations are marked with orange stars.
2. **Parks by Number of Spaces** – Red circles represent Family parks; green circles represent 55+ park communities. The relative size of each circle indicates the number of total spaces within the park.
3. **OR House Districts** – When the corresponding box in the Layers List is checked, district lines for the Oregon House of Representatives are drawn in orange. Districts are labeled with their numbers.
4. **OR Senate Districts** – Same as the House layer described above, but the lines will be in bright green.
5. **US Congressional Districts** – Same as the House and Senate district layers, but the lines will be in bright pink.
6. **Publicly Owned Utilities (from BPA)** – When activated, shows coverage areas for publicly owned utilities, shaded in gold (coverage according to Bonneville Power Administration as of September 2016).
7. **Investor-Owned Utilities (from BPA)** – When activated, shows coverage areas for investor-owned utilities, shaded in purple (coverage according to Bonneville Power Administration as of September 2016).
8. **Census Tract Data (ACS Estimates)** – Displays Census tracts in varying shades of blue according to the estimated number of manufactured homes in the tract constructed prior to 1980. Pop-up box contains additional demographic and housing stock information.




Figure 2: Popup box. Use the arrows to flip between pages, each of which will show another layer’s underlying data for the location selected.
