

Oregon Manufactured Home Park Directory


<p>An Overview</p>	<p>The Oregon Manufactured Home Parks Directory Map is a web application that shows the locations of all mobile/manufactured home parks reported to Oregon Housing and Community Services. Other layers display demographic and housing information from the American Community Survey (ACS) five-year estimates, various geographic boundaries, markers for OHCS-supported park preservation projects since 2006, and the service areas of numerous energy utility providers. The tools and icons marked on the map interface as shown in Figure 1 will help you to navigate the map and set your display preferences. Given below are the nine items that are marked on the map interface in Figure 1.</p> 
<p>Map Tools</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Search Box – Allows you to search for any address (or city, county, etc.) or park. To search for an open park, click the drop down arrow and select “Open_Parks” Information – Provides summary details about the map, as well as data sources, disclaimers, and links to the Data Dictionary (and this Guide) Zoom Tools – Zooms view in or out on the map Home Button – Returns to the default extent (view frame/zoom level) of the map Widgets: These provide summary statistics of important map layers and are dynamic. The data will update to as you change the map extent (the data shown will only be for the current extent; to get stats for the whole state of OR, make sure the whole state is visible in your view) Layer List/Legend: This is the map legend. To turn a layer on or off, check or uncheck its box.
<p>Toggle and Explore Layers</p>	<p>When a layer’s box is checked within the Layers List (item #6 in Figure 1), its data will be shown and can then be clicked on within the map. Clicking on any mapped area will bring up a pop-up window with all activated layers’ details shown, as they apply to the point clicked. For example, clicking on a manufactured home park (blue circles) will result in a window displaying the information for that park, as well as the ACS data for the Census tract in which the park lies (plus whichever other layers apply to that spot and are turned on).</p>

	<p>Layers</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Preserved Parks – Park locations are marked with white circles 2. Investor Owned Manufactured Home Park (Open) – Light Blue circles represent Family parks; dark blue circles represent 55+ park communities. The relative size of each circle indicates the number of total spaces within the park. 3. Investor-Owned Utilities (from BPA) – When activated, shows coverage areas for investor-owned utilities, shaded in light purple (coverage according to Bonneville Power Administration as of September 2016). 4. Publicly Owned Utilities (from BPA) – When activated, shows coverage areas for publicly owned utilities, shaded in Dark Purple (coverage according to Bonneville Power Administration as of September 2016). 5. Tribal Land: Tribal Land in the State of Oregon. Last updated in 2018 6. Year Built (Census Tracts): Displays Census tracts in varying shades of orange according to the estimated number of manufactured homes in the tract constructed prior to 1980 7. OR House Districts – When the corresponding box in the Layers List is checked, district lines for the Oregon House of Representatives are drawn in Green. Districts are labeled with their numbers. 8. OR Senate Districts – Same as the House layer described above, but the lines will be in blue. 9. Census Tract Data (ACS Estimates) – Pop-up box contains additional demographic and housing stock information.
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
