The applicant proposes to provide beverage container redemption services for the following stores:

If the OLCC approves the application, the redemption center will provide redemption services for redeemable bottles and cans and pay the 10-cent refund per container. If approved, the stores listed in Zone 1 will no longer accept returnable containers and the stores listed in Zone 2 will limit returns to 24 containers per person per day.

The applicant proposes to be open seven days per week from 8 AM to 7 PM in summer and from 8 AM to 6 PM during the rest of the year, and will provide bag drop-off services from 6 AM to 10 PM. The center will accept up to 350 containers per person per day through self-service machines and through a staff-operated high speed processing unit and 15 bags per account per calendar quarter. There will be 25 parking spaces available.

If approved, the redemption center is anticipated to open in Spring 2022. We are posting this public notice as part of the application process.
