COMMISSION MEMBERS:

INITIAL ACTION

- o **2024** *Marijuana Bill & Technical Package*<u>House Bill 4121</u> has several provisions that require agency rulemaking to implement. The agency must also undertake rulemaking to respond to changes within the industry.
- O Alcohol Bill & CAMP Implementation
 House Bill 4138 has several provisions that require agency rulemaking to implement. At the same time, the Cannabis and Alcohol Management Program (CAMP) is being configured for Alcohol Licensing and Service Permits, with planned launch dates of August 12th, 2024, for Alcohol Licensing and January 8th, 2025, for Service Permits.

FINAL ACTION

Over the course of 2023, staff updated marijuana rules due to legislation and responding to market realities via temporary rules. The commission also was forced to delay marijuana batch plant tagging due to procurement delays. This rule package finalizes those temporary actions by making them permanent rules.
