OLCC issues three sanctions to liquor licensees

PORTLAND, Ore. - At their monthly meeting February 12, the commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission ratified the following sanctions to Oregon licensees through stipulated settlement agreements.

Nye Street Station, 313 Nye Street, Pendleton; will accept a letter of reprimand and install age verification equipment and will use the equipment to verify the age of every customer purchasing alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26 years of age. The violation came as the result of an employee's failure to verify the age of a minor before allowing her to buy alcohol when she reasonably appeared under 26 years old. The licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is Hattenhauer Distributing Company; John and Mary Hattenhauer, Corporate Principals.

7-Eleven Store #2363-21907C, 1016 NE Kane, Gresham; will pay a civil penalty of \$1,815 or serve an 11-day suspension for an employee's failure to verify the age of a minor before allowing him to buy an alcoholic beverage when he reasonably appeared to be under 26. The licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is My Stars, Inc.; Steven Bertelson and Judy Bertelson, Corporate Principals.

Blue Sage Café of Lake Oswego, 7 Monroe Parkway #407A, Lake Oswego; will pay a \$1,815 civil penalty or serve an 11-day suspension for permitting three employees to sell, mix or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without valid service permits. The licensee is OSF International, Inc.; Chris Dussin, Harlan Dean Griffith, James J. Damis, and Dussin Family Holdings, LLC, Corporate Principals.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents. Commission meetings are held every other month at OLCC's main office, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Room 103A in Portland. Subsequent months, the meetings are held via phone.
