## OLCC issues nine sanctions to liquor licensees

**PORTLAND, Ore.** - At their monthly meeting March 16, the commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission ratified the following sanctions to Oregon licensees through stipulated settlement agreements.

**The Gold Bowl Restaurant**, 3582 SE Powell, Portland; has paid a civil penalty of \$330 and agrees to install age verification equipment, using the equipment to verify the age of every customer purchasing alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26. The violation came as the result of the licensee's failure to verify the age of a minor before allowing her to buy alcohol when she reasonably appeared under 26 years old. Licensees are Sheri Chan and Quen-Lun Chan.

**Carmichael's Pub & Grill**, 12740 SW Pacific Highway, Tigard; will pay a civil penalty of \$1,480 or serve a nine-day suspension for permitting an employee to sell, mix or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without a valid service permit. Licensee is HNN Limited, Inc.; Charles Heath, President.

**OHM**, 31 NW 1<sup>st</sup> St., Portland; will pay a civil penalty of \$1,155 or serve a seven-day suspension for accepting financial assistance from Young's Market, a distributor of alcoholic liquor. The licensee is Key Largo Associates, Inc.; David Elliott and Key Largo Acquisition Group LLC, Corporate Principals.

**A & B Market**, 33750 Santiam Highway, Lebanon; has paid a \$330 civil penalty and agrees to install age verification equipment, using the equipment to verify the age of every customer purchasing alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26. The violation came as the result of the licensee's failure to verify the age of a minor before allowing him to buy alcohol when he reasonably appeared under 26 years old. Licensee is A & B Market, LLC; Anita Schlitzkus and William Schlitzkus, Corporate Principals.

**Jeff & Jaff's Taboo**, 23 West 6<sup>th</sup> Ave., Eugene; will pay a civil penalty of \$3,795 or serve a 23-day suspension for permitting disorderly activities on the licensed premises that resulted in injury to multiple patrons. Licensee is Jeff, Jeff & Jaff Entertainment, Inc., Jeffery Lowe, Jeffery Gaulton and Stevan Jaffe, Corporate Principals.

**Cactus Jack's Café**, 4342 SW Beaverton Hillsdale Highway, Portland; will pay a \$1,155 civil penalty or serve a seven-day suspension for permitting a minor employee to mix, pour or draw alcoholic beverages in a portion of the premises that is prohibited to minors. Licensee is Desert Island Productions, Inc., Mitchell Stanley, President.

**Huang Cheng Chinese Restaurant**, 831 Alder St., Elgin; will pay a \$3,960 civil penalty or serve a 24-day suspension because the licensee permitted two minors to buy, be served or drink alcoholic beverages and permitted them to be on the licensed premises or in an area of the premises prohibited to minors. The licensee is Good 61, Inc., Tim Zhen and Xiong Chuang Zhen, Corporate Principals.

**Sushiville**, 1514 NW 23<sup>rd</sup> Ave. Portland and 663 NW Division St., Gresham; will accept a Letter of Reprimand and a license restriction prohibiting Insik Choe and Myong Shim Choe from the licensed premises at all times and from participating in the operation or management of the business. This came as the result of former Managing Member Insik Choe's conviction of a Class C Felony, Attempted Sexual Abuse in the First Degree, on the licensed premises. Licensee is Resture, LLC, Kiyoshi Adachi, Koonja Choi, Hack Moo Kim and Ilchul Shin, Corporate Principals.

**Lucky Lounge Chinese Food**, 562 4<sup>th</sup> St., Gervais; will accept a Letter of Reprimand as part of the permanent OLCC file because it no longer holds an interest in the liquor license. The licensee's employee failed to verify the age of a minor before allowing him to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age. Licensees are Susan Yeung and Wu Yong Yuan.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents. Commission meetings are held every other month at OLCC's main office, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Room 103A in Portland. Subsequent months, the meetings are held via phone.
