OLCC Commissioners issue 16 sanctions to Oregon licensees

PORTLAND, Ore. - At their monthly meeting July 13, the Commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission ratified the following sanctions based on stipulated settlements:

Guadalajara Family Mexican Restaurant, 2332 Poplar Drive, Medford; will pay a civil penalty of \$6,435 or serve a 39-day suspension and will be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program for two violations. The first violation occurred when the licensee violated a restriction on the license requiring the licensee and employees to use age verification equipment to verify the age of every person attempting to buy alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26 years. The second violation occurred when the licensee's employee failed to verify the age of a minor before allowing him to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he reasonably appeared to be under 26. Licensee is Ruiz Corp, Inc., Osvaldo Ruiz-Jaramillo, Corporate Principal.

Blue Olive, 4627 NE Fremont, Portland; will serve a 30-day suspension, accept restrictions on the license preventing Managing Member Farzad Larki from participating in the management, operation or control of the licensed premises as well as restricting Farzad Larki from being on the licensed premises for any other purpose than food preparation, and Farzad Larki will divest interest in the license, receiving a letter of reprimand for three violations. The first violation was due to Farzad Larki's conviction of a Class C Felony for Unlawful Distribution of Tobacco Products. The second violation occurred when the licensee made false a representation to the OLCC in order to prevent action by the Commission when submitting a license renewal application and provided no response under the section that requires a list of all arrests or convictions during the last 18 months. The third violation came as the result of the licensee failing to notify the OLCC immediately in writing when Homayoon Larki was added as Member of Larki Enterprises, LLC. Licensee is Larki Enterprises, LLC, Farzad Larki, Mohammad Ali Larki and Homayoon Larki, Members.

Quick Stop Deli Market, 602 NW 21st. Ave., Portland; will serve a 30-day suspension, accept restrictions on the license preventing Managing Member Farzad Larki from participating in the management, operation or control of the licensed premises as well as restricting Farzad Larki from being on the licensed premises and Farzad Larki will divest interest in the license, receiving a letter of reprimand for the three violations. The first violation occurred when Farzad Larki was convicted of a Class C Felony for Unlawful Distribution of Tobacco Products. The second violation took place when the licensee made a false representation to the OLCC in order to prevent action by the Commission when submitting a license renewal application and gave no response under the section that requires a list of all arrests or convictions during the last 18 months. The third violation came as the result of the licensee failing to notify the OLCC immediately in writing when Farzad Larki was added as Member of Larki and Sons, LLC. Licensee is Larki and Sons, LLC, Farzad Larki and Mohammad Ali Larki, Members.

For an employee(s) failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him/her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he/she reasonably appeared to be under 26:

LN Minit Market, 536 E. 11th Ave., Eugene; will pay a civil penalty of \$330 or serve a two-day suspension and will install age verification equipment and will utilize the equipment to verify the age of every patron buying alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26 years of age. Licensees are Sukhvinder Virk and Narvinder Virk.

Morrow's Serv-U Market, 18422 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Milwaukie; has paid a civil penalty of \$330 and has installed age verification equipment and will utilize the equipment to verify the age of every

patron buying alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26 years of age. Licensee is Dong-Kil Han.

J&J Market, 1532 SE Stephens St., Roseburg; will pay a \$660 civil penalty and will install age verification equipment and will utilize the equipment to verify the age of every patron buying alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26 years of age. Licensee is JC Park Corporation, Eung Park and Ji Young Park, Corporate Principals.

Sunriver Country Store, Sunriver Country Mall #1A, Sunriver; has installed age verification equipment and will utilize the equipment to verify the age of every patron buying alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26 years of age in lieu of paying a fine or serving a suspension. Licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is J A Marketing Corp., Inc., Joseph Audia and John Audia, Corporate Principals.

Ming Yang Restaurant, 5069 N. River Road, Keizer; has paid a civil penalty of \$3,795. Licensee is Ming Yang Restaurant, Inc., David Zhen and Cindy Zhen, Corporate Principals.

Malay Satay Hut Portland, 2850 SE 82nd Ave. #4, Portland; will pay a \$1,485 civil penalty or serve a nine-day suspension. Licensee is Malay Satay Hut Oregon, Inc., Pou Sang Yoo and Ah Yeok Soong, Corporate Principals.

Big River Restaurant & Bar, 101 NW Jackson St., Corvallis; has paid a civil penalty of \$1,485. Licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is Malmac, Inc., Brant Pollard and Carol Pollard, Corporate Principals.

Hoodland Thriftway, 68280 Highway 26, Welches; will pay a civil penalty of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day suspension. Licensee will be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is Hoodland Foods, LLC, PML Investments, LLC, Member.

East, 322 NW Everett, Portland; will pay a civil penalty of \$3,795 or serve a 23-day suspension. Licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is Liquid Enterprises, LLC, John Plummer, Brandon Brown and Michael Prescott, Members.

7-Eleven Store #2363-20175B, 15970 SE 82nd Drive, Portland; has installed age verification equipment and will utilize the equipment to verify the age of every patron buying alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26 years of age in lieu of paying a fine or serving a suspension. Licensees will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensees are Debra Schneider and Robert Schneider.

For permitting an employee(s) to sell, mix, or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without a service permit:

Headwaters, 1730 NW 9th St., Corvallis; will pay a civil penalty of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day suspension. Licensee is Salbasgeon, Inc., Frank Edel, David Edel, Nancy Edel and Rod Edel, Corporate Principals.

Platinum, 126 SW 4th St., Corvallis; will pay a \$1,485 civil penalty or serve a nine-day suspension. Licensee is Platinum Promo, LLC, Eric Beachy and Michael Randolph, Members.

Mt. Bachelor Main Lodge, 335 SW Century Drive, Bend; will pay a \$3,465 civil penalty or serve a 21-day suspension. Licensee is Mt. Bachelor, Inc., Matt Janney, David E. Cumming, Richard DesVaux, John D. Cumming, Nick Badami, Ian Cumming, Norman P. Kiken, Henry Tauber, Dave McKown and Powdr Corporation, Corporate Principals.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents. Commission meetings are held every other month at OLCC's main office, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Room 103A in Portland. Subsequent months, the meetings are held via phone.
