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## **OLCC Commissioners ratify sanctions for liquor license violations**

**PORTLAND, Ore.** – At their monthly meeting May 10, the Commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission ratified the following sanctions based on stipulated settlement:

**Vault Martini**, 226 NW 12<sup>th</sup>, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,155 or serve a seven-day liquor license suspension for selling, dispensing, serving, consuming, or allowing consumption of alcoholic liquor on the licensed premises between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. Licensee is Vault Martini, Inc.; Casey Hopkin and Carlos Cronquist, corporate principles.

**King's Wild Bar & Grill**, 13550 SE Powell Street, Portland; will serve a nine-day liquor license suspension for failing to take immediate and effective action to prevent unlawful drug use or sales at the business when the licensee witnessed drug use on the licensed premises. Licensee is Kings Wild Bar & Grill, LLC; Andy Maes, member.

**Clubhouse Bar & Grill**, 5134 SW Beaverton Hillsdale Highway, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,815 and serve a 42-day liquor license suspension or serve a 53-day liquor license suspension for three violations. The first violation is for an employee being under the influence of intoxicants while on duty. The second violation is for an employee recklessly interfering with an investigation by physical contact. The third violation is for permitting employees to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without valid service permits. Licensee is Clubhouse Bar & Grill, LLC; Tamela Arnold, member.

**Monte Carlo Sports Bar**, 1575 Mt Hood Avenue #130, Woodburn; will pay a fine of \$2,640 or serve a 16-day liquor license suspension for two violations. Both violations are for permitting unlawful activity when persons provided private security services without being certified to do so. Licensee is Monte Carlo Sports Bar, LLC; Javier Garcia, member.

**The Lodge Bar & Grill**, 6605 SE Powell, Portland; has paid a fine of \$2,640 for two violations. The first violation is for permitting disorderly activity when a person harassed, threatened, or physically harmed an employee. The second violation is for failing to evict people from the premises when they knew the people had engaged in noisy, disorderly, or unlawful activities. Licensee is Whiskey Girl Corporation; Janelle R. Shore, corporate principle.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him or her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he or she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age:

**Lil Pantry Market & Deli White City**, 7600 Crater Lake Hwy, White City; will pay a fine of \$3,795 or serve a 23-day liquor license suspension. Licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is Lil' Pantry LLC – White City; Dale C. Hurst and Daralyn Ann Hurst, members.

**Spuds N Suds**, 227 S. Oregon St., Ontario; will install age verification equipment and will use the equipment to verify the age of every person purchasing alcohol who reasonably appears under 26 years old. Licensee is Little Palomino, LLC; Rachael Heather Holtry, member.

**Sherwood Shell**, 20945 SW Pacific Highway, Sherwood; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Enserv, LLC; Jeffrey Johnston, George Johnston, and Mary Jo Johnston, members.

**Charley's BBQ**, 812 W Harvard Ave, Roseburg, will pay a fine of \$330 or serve a two-day suspension in addition to installing age verification equipment and using the equipment to verify the age of every person purchasing alcohol who reasonably appears under 26 years old. Licensee is CEI, Inc.; Christopher Lavington, and Elaine Lavington, corporate principles.

**Farmers Supply CO OP**, 150 Glenn Street, Vale; will pay a fine of \$330 or serve a two-day suspension in addition to installing age verification equipment and using the equipment to verify the age of every person purchasing alcohol who reasonably appears under 26 years old. Licensee is Farmers Supply Cooperative; James Hogg, Andrew Schram, Curtis Hickey, Murray Nishihara, and George Recla, corporate principals.

**Sushi & Roll**, 4671 Carnes Rd., Roseburg; will pay a fine of \$330 or serve a two-day suspension in addition to installing age verification equipment and using the equipment to verify the age of every person purchasing alcohol who reasonably appears under 26 years old. Licensee is Chun H. Kim.

**Lucky Mart**, 5287 N Lombard, Portland; has paid a fine of \$1,485. Licensees are Hanh Nguyen and Tony Dinh.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for permitting an employee(s) to mix, sell, or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without a service permit:

**Hog Rock Café**, 1281 SW 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Ontario will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Waterhole Saloon, Inc.; Fred Currey and Katherine Currey, corporate principles.

**Players OTB & Lounge**, 1486 Hawthorne Avenue, NE, Salem; will pay a fine of \$2,145 or serve a 13-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Canton Garden, Inc.; Qian Hua Jiang, and Lu Lu Song, corporate principles.

**Wild River Brewing & Pizza Co.**, 2684 N Pacific Hwy, Medford; will pay a fine of \$1,815 or serve an 11-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Wild River Medford, LLC; Jerry Miller and Bertha Miller, members.

The Commissioners also adopted temporary rules (OAR 845-009-0010 and OAR 845-009-0015) to reflect statutory amendments affecting growler refill stations. The temporary rules require employees of licensees with Off-premises liquor licenses that also sell growlers to hold a valid service permit. These temporary rules expire November 6, 2013. During this time, staff will pursue permanent rulemaking.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents. Commission meetings are held every other month at OLCC's main office, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Room 103A in Portland. Subsequent months, the meetings are held via phone.
