Oregon Liquor Control Commission
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OLCC Commissioners approve sanctions for liquor law violations

Portland, OR – At their monthly meeting Friday, January 24, 2014, the Commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission

The Commissioners appointed the following Distillery Retail Liquor Outlet:

Rolling River Spirits, 1215 SE Eighth Ave., Suite H; Portland

Distillery retail agents have the ability to allow sales of their own distilled spirits products at the location of their distillery outlet.

The Commissioners adopted the following administrative rule changes:

OAR 845-005-0440 Temporary Sales Licenses – This change brings the rule into compliance with Senate Bill 795 that allows the holder of a Temporary Sales License to sell wine, malt beverages and cider in both factory-sealed containers and securely covered containers provided by the consumer (i.e., growlers) provided that these containers do not hold more than two gallons of liquid each.

OAR 845-005-0431 and 845-006-0452 Distilled Liquor Tastings Package – These amendments implement the changes from House Bill 3435 that allow a distillery licensee to conduct tastings at its annually licensed premises and at up to five other premises that it owns or leases. Previously, the rules only allowed for tastings at one location.

The Commissioners ratified the following sanctions based on stipulated settlement:

D & D Bar & Grill, 927 NW Bond, Bend; has paid a fine of \$1,155 for permitting unlawful activity when an employee provided private security services without being certified to do so. Licensee is Orazetti, Inc.; Amanda Orazetti, Ricardo Orazetti, and Richard Orazetti, corporate principals.

Cruz Room, 2338 NE Alberta St., Portland; has paid a fine of \$1,485 for permitting unlawful activity when an employee provided private security services without being certified to do so. Licensee is Cruz Room, LLC; CUB Enterprises, LLC, Guy Barnes, Jr., Octavio Cruz-Uribe, members.

Virtue Cider, 2024 W. Roscoe Street, #1B, Chicago, IL; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension for allowing an employee to drink alcoholic beverages while on duty. Licensee is Virtue Holdings, LLC; Stephen Schmakel and Greg Hall, members.

Caribe Club, 8640 SW Canyon Rd., Portland; will serve a 25-day liquor license suspension for making alcoholic liquor available to a visibly intoxicated patron. Licensee is Latin Corner, LLC; David Rivero, member.

Trio Club, 909 E. Burnside, Portland; will pay a fine of \$3,300 or serve a 20-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for permitting the sale of distilled spirits by the bottle for consumption on the premises. The second violation is for permitting an employee to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. Licensee is Foo-Hong Foong.

Stars Cabaret Bridgeport, 17939 SW McEwan Road, Tigard; will serve a 30-day liquor license suspension in addition to paying a fine of \$1,155 or serve a 37-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for failing to comply with a license restriction. The second violation is for permitting unlawful

activity when an employee provided private security services without being certified to do so. Licensee is SCTO, Inc.; Jeff Struhar, Todd Mitchell, Randy Kaiser, and Nimby, LLC; corporate principals.

Pepino's, 3832 SE Hawthorne Blvd., Portland; will pay a fine of \$3,135 or serve a 27-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for making false statements to the Commission in order to induce or prevent action by the Commission. The second violation is for permitting employees to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without valid service permits. Licensee is Ay Caramba, LLC; Andrew Klein and Patricia Klein, members.

Café Alchemy, 6800 NE Martin Luther King Blvd., Portland; will serve a 30-day liquor license suspension and pay a fine of \$1,155 or serve a 37-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for failing to maintain liquor liability insurance or a corporate surety of at least \$300,000. The second violation is for permitting an employee to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. Licensee is Café Alchemy, LLC; Tamarat Alumu, member.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him or her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he or she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age:

Cha Cha Cha Taqueria, 4727 NE Fremont, Suite A Portland; will pay a fine of \$330 or serve a two-day liquor license suspension and will install age verification equipment and will use the equipment to verify the age of every person purchasing alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26 years old. Licensee is Cha Cha Cha Taqueria, Inc.; Francisco J. Diaz Hurtado, corporate principal.

The Back Street Pub, 272 NW 5th Street, Madras; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Jordan Pubs, LLC; Sanjeev Kumar, member.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for permitting an employee(s) to mix, sell, or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without a service permit:

The Inn Between, 67958 Highway 26, Welches; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Kenneth Brazer.

Hotpot & Sushi Cascade, 10127 NE Cascade Parkway, Portland; will pay a fine of \$2,145 or serve a 13-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is AJP Associates, LLC; Peter Lee and Hyun Jang, members.

Pepino's, 914 NW 23rd, Portland; will pay a fine of \$2,805 or serve a 17-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Ay Caramba, LLC; Andrew Klein and Patricia Klein, members.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents. Commission meetings are held every other month at OLCC's main office, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Room 103A in Portland. Subsequent months, the meetings are held via phone.
