OLCC Commissioners Ratify Stipulated Settlements for Recreational Marijuana Violations

PORTLAND, Ore. – At its monthly meeting March 22, 2018 the Commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission ratified the following fines and/or marijuana license suspensions based on stipulated settlements:

Grateful Meds, Jackson County; will pay a fine of \$6,105 or serve a 37-day recreational marijuana retailer license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for the licensee or its employees, agents, or representatives failing to keep surveillance recordings for a minimum of 90 calendar days. The second violation is for is for the licensee or its employees, agents, or representatives failing to store marijuana items for sale in such a manner that the items were only accessible to authorized representatives until such time as the final sale to the consumer was completed. Licensee is Grateful Meds, LLC; Brent Kenyon, Managing Member.

Bosmere Farms, Benton County; will pay a fine of \$4,125 or serve a 25-day recreational marijuana retailer license suspension for three violations. The first violation is for the licensee or its employees, agents, or representatives making physical changes to the licensed premises that materially or substantially altered the licensed premises or the usage of the licensed premises from the plans originally approved by the Commission when they used newly-constructed greenhouses located on the for the purpose of hanging and drying cut marijuana without prior approval of the Commission. The second violation is for the licensee or its employees, agents, or representatives using newly-constructed greenhouses for the purpose of storing cut and drying mature marijuana plants which were not secured with a steel door and steel door frame and commercial lock. The third violation is for using newly-constructed greenhouses for the purpose of storing cut and drying mature marijuana plants which were not secured with a steel door and steel door frame and commercial lock. Licensee is Bosmere Farms, Inc.; Glenmore James, President/Stockholder, Jill James, Secretary/Stockholder, Daniel James, Stockholder.
