Oregon Liquor Control Commission
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OLCC Commissioners Ratify Stipulated Alcohol Settlements and Hear Testimony

PORTLAND, OR – At its monthly meeting Sept. 21, 2018, the Commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission ratified the following fines based on stipulated settlement:

Marathon Taverna, 1735 W Burnside, Portland, will pay a \$1,485.00 civil penalty or serve a nine-day suspension for permitting disorderly activities on the licensed premises or in areas the licensee controls that are adjacent to the premises when it's employees, agents, servants or representatives knew of the disorderly activity of a patron but failed to take reasonable steps to prevent further disorder involving him. Licensee is KAP, Inc.; Konstantinos Polizos, president; Martha Polizos, secretary; Anestis Polizos, vice president; and Vasiliki Polizos, treasurer.

Jockey Club, 401 SW Alder, Portland, will pay a \$1,155.00 civil penalty or serve a seven-day suspension. Licensee or its employees, representatives or agents failed to evict all persons who were involved in disorderly activities from the licensed premises for at least a 24-hour period, when multiple patrons and employees were involved in a verbal and physical altercation and only three of the patrons involved were evicted from the premises. Licensee is Dionysus, LLC; Manish Patel, managing member; Frank Faillace, member.

Commissioners additionally heard testimony on the following topics:

Presentation by Jason Brandt and Greg Astley of Oregon Restaurant and Lodging Association on their appreciation for the work of the commission. They also shared their commitment to continue to provide quality training for the alcohol service industry which helps preserve public safety. Commissioners took the opportunity to ask them about additional issues, such as after-hours drinks.

Briefing on the marketing of wine and agricultural viticulture areas by Oregon wine industry representatives. Presenters included members from Willamette Valley Vineyards, King Estate Winery and the Oregon Winegrowers Association.

Commissioners also granted delegated authority to the Commission's Director Steve Marks to enter into public drawings. This delegated authority will allow the Commission to enter into public drawings to offer the public the chance to purchase spirits that are rare or in limited supply. In the presentation before Commissioners, Commission staff outlined details of the first public drawing that will be launching Oct 4, 2018. This drawing will be for the chance to purchase one of six limited edition 2018 Old Forester Birthday Bourbons.
