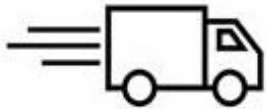
The Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission (OLCC) is providing the following information to licensees and laboratory licensees.

This education bulletin is part of OLCC's compliance education. It is important that you read it and understand it. If you do not understand it, please contact the OLCC for help.

Marijuana licensees and laboratory licensees are responsible for reading, understanding, and complying with all applicable rules. This bulletin does not supersede any OLCC rule. Failure to understand and follow the rules referenced in this bulletin *could result in an OLCC administrative violation and/or civil penalty.*

Know Your Boundaries

The OLCC has created a new home delivery section on its website -- [Marijuana Home Delivery in Oregon](#) section.

Cities and counties can now "opt-in" to allow licensed cannabis retailers to make marijuana home deliveries from adjacent jurisdictions.

Prior to the modification cannabis retailers were only allowed to make deliveries to home residences within the city or county where the retailer was physically located. The home delivery change is a result of legislation approved by the 2021 Oregon Legislature.

In the "Know Your Boundaries" section there are **two** resource segments for taking action - **one for cities and counties** that want to consider allowing adjacent jurisdiction delivery, and **another for OLCC licensees** that want to offer this type of delivery.

The OLCC has created an interactive [OLCC Marijuana Home Delivery Map](#) that can be used to figure out if an OLCC licensed cannabis retailer is allowed to make a home delivery to an adjacent city or county.

A local government must first approve a local ordinance allowing adjacent jurisdiction delivery before a retailer in an adjacent city or county can make those deliveries. Here's an example of how that would work:

*A retailer in **City A** wants to make home deliveries within **City B**. **City B** must first pass a city ordinance allowing deliveries from **City A**, and notify the OLCC of that change. After that notification, a retailer in **City A** can begin offering and making deliveries in **City B**.*
