BOARD ACTION REPORT
August 15, 2017

The information contained in this report summarizes new, interim, and final actions taken by the Oregon Medical Board between July 16, 2017, and August 15, 2017.

Scanned copies of Interim Stipulated Orders, Orders of Emergency Suspension, Stipulated Orders, Final Orders, Termination Orders, Modification Orders and Voluntary Limitations are included at the end of this report in the order that they appear in the report. These orders are marked with an * asterisk. **Scanned copies of Consent Agreements are not posted, as they are not disciplinary action and impose no practice limitations.** Complaint and Notices of Proposed Disciplinary Action are not listed in this report, as they are not final actions by the Board. Both Orders, however, are public and are available upon request.

***Aanderud, Paul Jeffrey, DO; DO157838; Hillsboro, OR**

On July 31, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily cease performing Mohs surgery on any patient pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

***Jackson, Larry Arthur, MD; MD08513; Creswell, OR**

On August 3, 2017, the Board issued an Order Terminating Stipulated Order. This Order terminates Licensee's January 8, 2015, Stipulated Order.

***Jackson, Larry Arthur, MD; MD08513; Creswell, OR**

On August 3, 2017, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for unprofessional conduct and willful violation of a Board order. With this Order Licensee surrenders his Oregon medical license while under investigation.

***Reagan, Charles Peter, MD; MD19027; Coos Bay, OR**

On August 3, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily cease the prescribing of any opioid medication with the exception of buprenorphine/naloxone, and to cease the ordering of genetic testing for pharmacokinetics pending the completion of the

Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine. The prescribing restriction becomes effective 60 days from the effective date of the order.

***Texidor, Cesareo, Jr., PA; PA01110; Pendleton, OR**

On July 17, 2017, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for unprofessional conduct; impairment; and gross or repeated acts of negligence. With this Order Licensee permanently surrenders his Oregon physician assistant license while under investigation.

Watts, Lisa Diane, DO; DO21895; Tigard, OR

On August 1, 2017, Licensee entered into a Consent Agreement for Re-Entry to Practice with the Board. In this Agreement, Licensee agreed to practice under the supervision of a pre-approved mentor for six months, to include chart review and reports to the Board by the mentor.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including osteopathic physicians, in the State of Oregon. Paul Jeffrey Aanderud, DO (Licensee) is a licensed osteopathic physician in the State of Oregon and holds an active medical license.

2.

The Board received credible information regarding Licensee that resulted in the Board initiating an investigation. The results of the Board's investigation to date have raised concerns to the extent that the Board believes it necessary that Licensee agree to certain terms until the investigation is completed.

3.

In order to address the Board's concerns, Licensee and the Board agree to the entry of this Interim Stipulated Order, which is not an admission of any wrongdoing on the part of the Licensee, and will remain in effect while this matter remains under investigation, and provides that Licensee shall comply with the following conditions:

3.1 Licensee will not perform Mohs surgery on any patient.

3.2 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

3.3 Licensee understands this Order becomes effective the date he signs it.

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4.

At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, the Board will decide whether to close the case or to proceed to some form of disciplinary action. If the Board determines, following that review, not to lift the requirements of this Order, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that decision.

5.

This order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.410, which grants the Board the authority to attach conditions to the license of Licensee to practice medicine. These conditions will remain in effect while the Board conducts a complete investigation in order to fully inform itself with respect to the conduct of Licensee. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative materials are confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure, nor shall they be admissible as evidence in any judicial proceeding. However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document and is reportable to the National Databank and the Federation of State Medical Boards.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the State of Oregon. Larry Arthur Jackson, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the State of Oregon.

2.

On January 8, 2015, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board. This Order placed Licensee on probation and required Licensee to complete an education plan created by the Center for Personalized Education for Physicians. Licensee has failed to complete this education plan.

3.

Licensee and the Board desire to settle this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order. Licensee understands that he has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act (Oregon Revised Statutes chapter 183), and fully and finally waives the right to a contested case hearing and any appeal therefrom by the signing of this Order in the Board's records. Licensee neither admits nor denies, but the Board finds that Licensee engaged in conduct that violated the Medical Practice Act, to wit: ORS 677.190(1)(a), unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a); and ORS 677.190 (17) willful violation of a Board order. Licensee understands that this Order is a public record and is a disciplinary action that is reportable to the DataBank and the Federation of State Medical Boards.

2 Licensee and the Board agree that the Board will close this investigation and resolve this
3 matter by entry of this Stipulated Order, subject to the following conditions:

4 4.1 Licensee surrenders his Oregon medical license while under investigation.

5 4.2 Licensee must obey all Federal and Oregon State laws and regulations pertaining
6 to the practice of medicine.

7 4.3 Licensee stipulates and agrees that any violation of the terms of this Order shall
8 be grounds for further disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

10 This Order becomes effective the date it is signed by the Board Chair.



Having fully considered the surrender of Licensee's medical license, the Board terminates the January 8, 2015, Stipulated Order effective the date this Order is signed by the Board Vice Chair.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Charles Peter Reagan, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon and holds an active medical license.

2.

The Board received credible information regarding Licensee that resulted in the Board initiating an investigation. The results of the Board's investigation to date have raised concerns to the extent that the Board believes it necessary that Licensee agree to certain terms until the investigation is completed.

3.

In order to address the Board's concerns, Licensee and the Board agree to the entry of this Interim Stipulated Order, which is not an admission of any wrongdoing on the part of the Licensee, and will remain in effect while this matter remains under investigation, and provides that Licensee shall comply with the following conditions:

3.1 Licensee must not prescribe any opioid medication with the exception of buprenorphine/naloxone. This term is effective 60 days from the date Licensee signs this Order. During this 60 day period, Licensee must facilitate the transfer of medical records for any patient who transfers care to another provider.

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1 3.2 Prior to the effective date of term 3.1, Licensee must not: begin treatment with
 2 any opioid medication, with the exception of buprenorphine/naloxone, for any new or existing
 3 patient; increase the dosage of any opioid medication for any existing patient, with the exception
 4 of buprenorphine/naloxone; begin treating any existing patient that is already on opioids with
 5 other controlled substances or increase the dosage of other controlled substances.

6 3.3 Licensee must not order genetic testing for pharmacokinetics.

7 3.4 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for
 8 disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

9 3.5 Licensee understands this Order becomes effective the date he signs it.

10 4.

11 At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, the Board will decide whether to close the
 12 case or to proceed to some form of disciplinary action. If the Board determines, following that
 13 review, not to lift the requirements of this Order, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that
 14 decision.

15 5.

16 This order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.410, which grants the Board the
 17 authority to attach conditions to the license of Licensee to practice medicine. These conditions
 18 will remain in effect while the Board conducts a complete investigation in order to fully inform
 19 itself with respect to the conduct of Licensee. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative
 20 materials are confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure, nor shall they be admissible

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1 as evidence in any judicial proceeding. However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document
2 and is reportable to the National Databank and the Federation of State Medical Boards.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physician assistants, in the State of Oregon. Cesareo Texidor, Jr., PA (Licensee) is a licensed physician assistant (inactive status) in the State of Oregon.

2.

On November 23, 2016, the Board issued a Complaint and Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action in which the Board proposed taking disciplinary action by imposing up to the maximum range of potential sanctions identified in ORS 677.205(2), to include the revocation of license, a \$10,000 fine, and assessment of costs, pursuant to ORS 677.205 against Licensee for violations of the Medical Practice Act., to wit: ORS 677.190(1)(a), as defined by ORS 677.188(4)(a); ORS 677.190(7); and ORS 677.190(13). On April 28, 2017, the Board issued an Amended Complaint and Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action alleging the same violations of the Medical Practice Act.

3.

Licensee and the Board desire to settle this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order. Licensee understands that he has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act (Oregon Revised Statutes chapter 183), and fully and finally waives the right to a contested case hearing and any appeal therefrom by the signing of this Order in the Board's records. Licensee neither admits nor denies, but the Board finds that Licensee engaged in

1 conduct that violated the Medical Practice Act as described in the Amended Complaint and
2 Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action dated April 28, 2017. Licensee understands that this
3 Order is a public record and is a disciplinary action that is reportable to the DataBank and the
4 Federation of State Medical Boards.

5 4.

6 Licensee and the Board agree that the Board will close the investigations and resolve this
7 matter by entry of this Stipulated Order, subject to the following conditions:

8 4.1 Licensee permanently surrenders his Oregon physician assistant license while
9 under investigation.

10 4.2 Licensee stipulates and agrees that this Order becomes effective the date that he
11 signs this Order, and the Order will be presented to the Board for ratification during the next
12 regularly scheduled meeting of the Board.

13 4.3 By signing this Order, Licensee understands and agrees that he may not withdraw
14 his agreement or seek to rescind the Order prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it.
15 If the Board fails to adopt this Order, the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by
16 having considered this matter.

17 4.4 Licensee must obey all Federal and Oregon State laws and regulations pertaining
18 to the practice of medicine.

19 4.5 Licensee stipulates and agrees that any violation of the terms of this Order shall
20 be grounds for further disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

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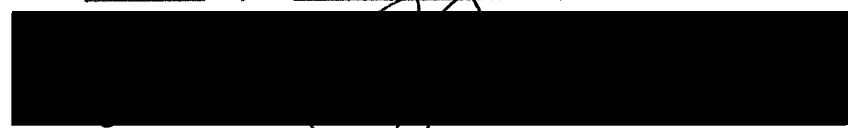
