- Member Must Meet All Eligibility Criteria in ANGI 36-101, The Active Guard/Reserve Program.
- Member Will Be Required to Hold a Compatible Military Assignment in The Unit They Are Hired to Support.
- Member's Military Grade Will Not Exceed the Maximum Military Duty Grade Authorized on The Unit Manning Document (UMD) For the Position.
- Member Must Meet the Physical Qualifications Outlined in DAFMAN 48-123, Medical Examination and Standards, Attachment 2 Before Being Placed on An AGR Tour.
- Member Must Have Retainability to Complete the Tour of Military Duty.
- Member Must Not Be Eligible for Or Receiving a Federal Retirement Annuity.
- Member Must Comply with Standards Outlined in DAFMAN 36-2905, Fitness Program to Be Eligible for Entry into The AGR Program.
- Member Must Hold Required AFSC Or Be Eligible for Retraining (If Applicable) And Meet All Eligibility Criteria In AFECD/AFOCD

  - Current, Passing score at time of submission and through announcement close date
  - Form 469 is required for exemptions on most recent fitness assessment even if expired
- **Official AF Form 422 current within 12 months only if Cross-Training Opportunity is applicable**
- **Additional Required Documents:**
  - Last 3 EPB/ OPBs

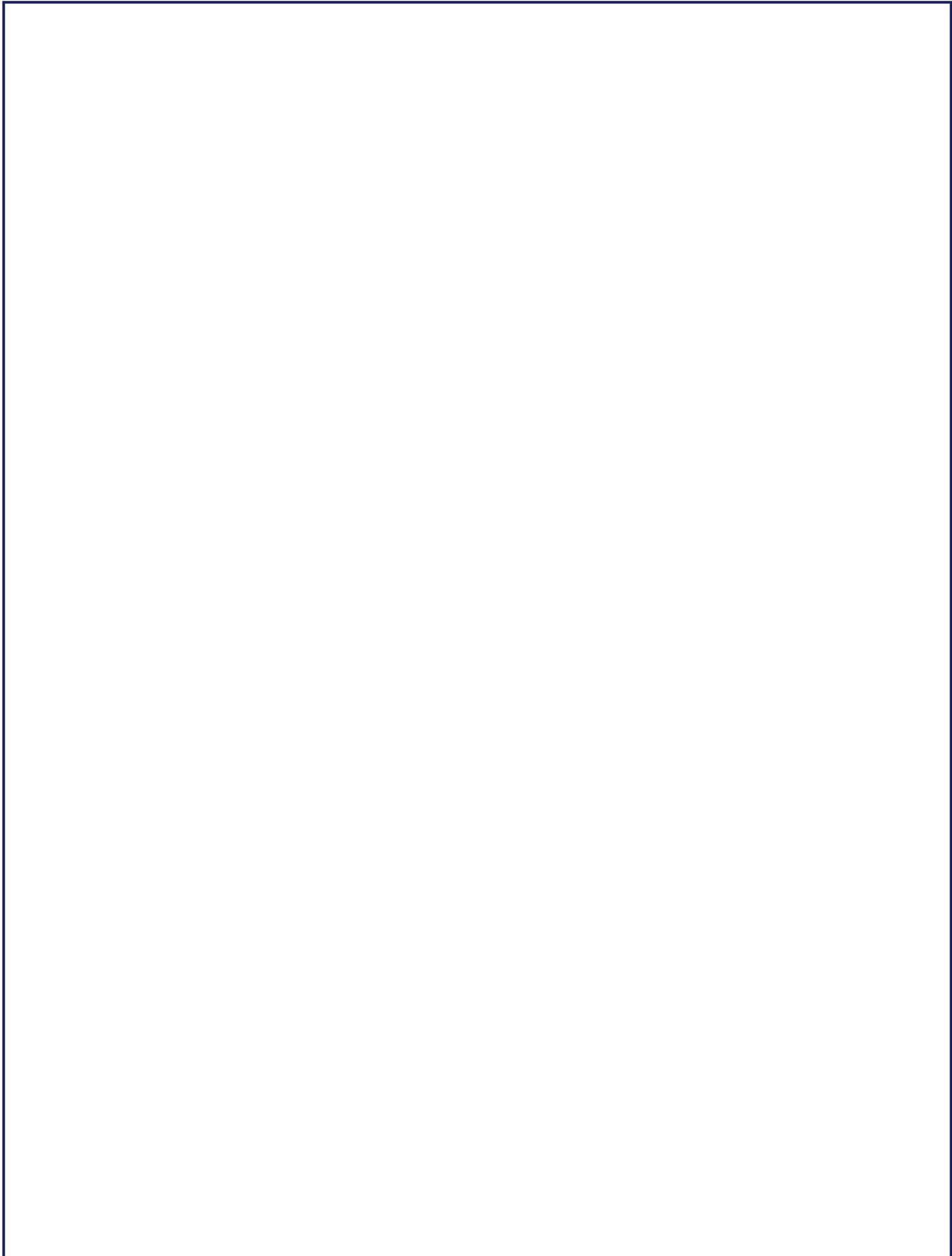

**DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES**

Serves as the Senior Enlisted Leader in an Oregon Air National Guard Squadron. Conducts, supervises, manages and evaluates Special Tactics activities in support of Title 32 and Title 10 mission essential tasks. Will provide and have knowledge of; special operation missions, training requirements, standardization/evaluation programs, finance/budgeting, and ST mission-specific manpower and logistics programs. Responsible for the general supervision, career management, oversight and mentorship of all assigned enlisted AFSC's in the squadron. Communicates the commander's policies and programs to the total force. Represents the 125th STS Commander at various meetings as required. Actively participates on advisory councils and boards Establishes and oversees all hiring boards and interview procedures for squadron AFSC recruitment. Works closely with service recruiters to ensure all applicants are initially and properly vetted prior to hire. Functions as the squadron liaison to the local community, facilitates member-employer relationships, and provides support to the state of Oregon JFHQ and the National Guard Bureau. Coordinates with ANG unit Senior Enlisted Leaders to assist in solving problems created from compliance with USAF, MAJCOM, or ANG policy. Builds and maintains a synergistic relationship with the local community emergency management agencies, police, civilian SAR and Air and Ground components to promote state entity interoperability during Title 32 mission sets. Monitors and ensures training and equipment compliance for enlisted force deployment and taskings. Actively leads in the unit's fitness program. Coordinates on all communications (written and oral) impacting the enlisted force or base community. Assists with the professional growth/mentoring of civilian and officer supervisors of enlisted. Ensures the organization's Officers and new squadron commanders are advised of the Enlisted Force Management Plan. Understands the operation and mission of the organization and all subordinate elements in the Special Tactics Squadron. Understands AF doctrine and core leadership competencies and communicates these to the force during enlisted calls, briefings and awards recognition.
