DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES

1. Supports all aspects of Air Force operations by discovering, collating, analyzing, evaluating, and disseminating intelligence information. Produces all-source intelligence products, including situation estimates, and threat assessments or studies on adversarial nations, terrorist organizations, and insurgent groups. Advises commanders on force protection and intelligence matters impacting US and Partner Nations forces and interests. Conducts intelligence debriefings of US and allied military personnel involved in combat operations and prepares mission reports to disseminate information gathered on adversaries.
2. Conducts intelligence training. Instructs military personnel on collecting and reporting requirements and procedures, recognition techniques, and assessing offensive and defensive weapon system capabilities. Assists Survival Evasion Resistance and Escape (SERE) and Aircrew Flight Equipment personnel in developing Area of Responsibility (AOR) specific personnel recovery and code of conduct training, when necessary. Collates intelligence and operations materials, and assembles final products for mission briefing, study, and use.
3. Produces intelligence materials. Prepares, maintains, and presents intelligence displays, reports, and briefings. Discovers, compiles, evaluates, researches, analyzes, and disseminates intelligence information. Establishes intelligence collection requirements. Identifies and establishes unit requirements for intelligence reference materials and maintains intelligence reference files and automated intelligence databases. Uses intelligence automated data systems to store, retrieve, display, and report intelligence information.
4. Performs support to mission planning and execution. Provides tailored collections planning, threat analysis, and intelligence expertise necessary to develop detailed mission plans for air, space, cyberspace, and special operations. Provides current situational awareness and Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (ISR) management for the accomplishment of the Air Tasking Order (ATO), Integrated Tasking Order (ITO), Cyber Tasking Order (CTO) or Space Tasking Order (STO). Analyzes intelligence to support military operations. Assists in the performance of, targeting functions to include target development, weaponeering, force application, mission planning, and combat assessment.
5. Intelligence Support to Base Defense (ISBD). Provides Base Defense (BD) intelligence support to commanders and their staff, and forces at home station, in transit, and deployed locations through all-source intelligence products and briefings, focusing on human threat capabilities, tactics, trends, courses of action, and ongoing threats within the unit's Area of Interest (AOI) or AOR. Supports counter-small Unmanned Aerial Systems (C-sUAS) efforts by integrating with BD entities to detect, analyze, and defeat threat UAS platforms. Conducts continuous analysis of incoming intelligence to assess its impact on BD operations and ensures BD considerations are incorporated into current intelligence updates, pre-mission planning, and pre-deployment briefings. Supports Mission Defense Teams (MDTs) by providing cyber threat intelligence and situational awareness to safeguard mission-critical systems. Contributes to base Information Warfare Working Groups (IWWG) by fusing intelligence across multiple domains to inform commanders of emerging threats in the information environment. Provides intelligence training and guidance to units on BD-related topics, supporting both internal and external training requirements. Participates in installation-level Threat Working Groups (TWG) and contributes to the development of realistic human threat scenarios for exercises to enhance readiness.
6. Analyzes and delivers written and oral intelligence products on strategic, operational, and tactical threats and targets to inform senior military leaders and national decision-makers, providing actionable assessments that support long-term planning, policy development, interagency coordination across defense and national security domains.
7. Other duties and Wing/Group/Squadron/Flight level additional programs as assigned.
