## DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Assists the Senior Intelligence Officer (SIO) in ensuring the Intelligence function maintains a capability to provide timely and accurate operational intelligence support and fully trained intelligence personnel during peacetime and contingency operations.
2. Performs assigned operational intelligence research and analysis, develops and projects data, draws meaningful conclusions and clear estimates based on current and past intelligence situations. Briefs findings and analytical estimates of assigned research to superiors, planners, and policy makers. Provides detailed threat analysis for mission planning and pre-mission briefings to the Mission Planning Cell (MPC). Proficient in debriefing aircrews, extracting critical information on mission results and threats encountered. Provides in-depth finished analysis of missions through the fusing of Mission Report (MISREP), and other intelligence sources.

3. Assists in training and testing pilots on worldwide threats that affect mission success, to include surface-to-air missile (SAM) systems, air-to-air missiles (AAM), air defense artillery (ADA), and airborne threats. Provides clarity to mission training and employment taking into account geopolitical issues, worldwide threat employment capabilities, tactics, techniques, and procedures of allied and threat entities. Additionally, trains aircrew on survival, evasion, resistance, and escape; search and rescue; and visual recognition techniques.

4. When necessary, coordinates with external operational elements as well as intelligence counterparts and colleagues in major commands and civilian intelligence organizations to include but not limited to: Air Combat Command (ACC), Air Mobility Command (AMC), National Guard Bureau Headquarters (NGB), United States Air Forces Europe (USAFE), Pacific Air Forces (PACAF), Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA), National Security Agency (NSA), U.S. Space Command (SPACECOM), U.S. Strategic Command (USSTRATCOM), and the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), National Air and Space Intelligence Center (NASIC), Missile and Space Intelligence Center (MSIC).

5. Duties, responsibilities, and specialty qualifications as outlined in the Air Force Officer Classification Directory (AFOCD) for Intelligence Officers.

Highly Desired Skills and Experience:

1. Fighter Squadron Unit Level Intelligence (ULI)
2. Formal Military Instructor experience; experience instructing Air Force Intelligence Officer Course, Air Force Operations Intelligence Course, Mission Design Series (MDS) specific Intelligence Formal Training Unit course, is preferred.
3. Prior attendance/participation in large force aerial exercises and deployments providing ULI support to flying squadrons.
