## DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Special Tactics Flight Surgeon provides direct medical support, oversight, and specialized care for elite Special Tactics operators (Combat Controllers, Pararescuemen, Special Reconnaissance, and Tactical Air Control Party). This role requires operating in high-demand, austere, and geographically separated environments to ensure the medical readiness and human performance optimization of special operations forces.

### Primary Duties:

**Operational Medical Support:** Serve as the primary medical authority for the Special Tactics Squadron. Provide comprehensive medical care, flight medicine, and trauma resuscitation capabilities in garrison and during global deployments.

**Human Performance & Readiness:** Direct the unit's medical readiness program. Oversee flight physicals, waivers, and the Human Performance Optimization (HPO) program to ensure operators maintain peak physical and cognitive readiness.

**Tactical Integration:** Integrate with Special Tactics teams during training and real-world operations. Advise the unit commander on all aerospace medicine, occupational health, and aeromedical evacuation matters.

**Training & Oversight:** Provide medical oversight, credentialing, and continuous tactical combat casualty care (TCCC) training for unit medics (e.g., Pararescuemen/PJs and Independent Duty Medical Technicians/IDMTs).

**Aeromedical Evacuation:** Coordinate and participate in casualty evacuation (CASEVAC) and aeromedical evacuation (AE) planning and execution.

### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS & REQUIREMENTS

**Education:** Doctor of Medicine (MD) or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO) degree from an approved institution.

**Licensure:** Must possess and maintain a current, unrestricted license to practice medicine in a State, the District of Columbia, or a U.S. territory.

**Certification:** Board certification or board eligibility in Aerospace Medicine, Emergency Medicine, Family Practice, or a related specialty is highly desired.

**Training:** Must have completed or be eligible to attend the Aerospace Medicine Primary (AMP) course to obtain the 48G AFSC.

**Clearance:** Must possess or be able to obtain a Top Secret / Sensitive Compartmented Information (TS/SCI) security clearance.

**Physical:** Must meet Air Force physical fitness standards and pass a Flying Class II flight physical. Airborne (parachutist) and diving medical clearances are highly desirable.

**Military Affiliation:** Must be a current member of, or eligible for accession into, the Air National Guard.
