DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The NCOIC of the Structures Element leads, manages, and directs military personnel in the construction, maintenance, and repair of installation facilities and infrastructure. As a key Senior NCO within the Civil Engineer Operations Flight, the NCOIC is responsible for project management, resource allocation, and the technical execution of carpentry, masonry, metal fabrication, welding, and roofing operations. This position requires a strategic leader who ensures Prime BEEF readiness, drives deliberate enlisted development, and aligns shop capabilities with wing/installation mission priorities.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- **Leadership & Personnel Management:** Directs the daily operations of the Structures element, providing mentorship, performance feedback, and professional development for [Insert Number] military and civilian personnel. Cultivates a high-trust, decentralized execution culture.

- **Project & Work Order Management:** Oversees the prioritization, planning, and execution of facility maintenance and minor construction work orders. Reviews blueprints, structural specifications, and engineering drawings to ensure compliance with building codes, environmental regulations, and safety standards.
- **Resource & Logistics Stewardship:** Manages element budget, procurement programs (e.g., Government Purchase Card), and material logistics. Oversees the accountability, maintenance, and life-cycle management of heavy equipment, specialized tools, and a multi-million-dollar vehicle fleet.
- **Readiness & Contingency Operations:** Ensures maximum operational readiness for Prime BEEF deployment requirements. Directs contingency training programs encompassing rapid runway repair, field expedient construction, and bare base beddown operations.
- **Quality Assurance & Safety:** Serves as the primary authority on structural quality control. Enforces strict adherence to OSHA, Air Force Office of Safety and Health (AFOSH), and local safety directives to maintain a mishap-free work environment.
- **Strategic Advisement:** Acts as the primary structural advisor to the Facility Systems Superintendent and Base Civil Engineer. Coordinates cross-functionally with Electrical, HVAC, Heavy Repair, and Engineering elements to execute complex, multi-craft projects.
- Other duties as required

The following items may result in disqualification:

- No record of disciplinary action resulting in an Article 15 for committing acts of misconduct or engaging in an unprofessional or inappropriate relationship as defined in AFI 36-2909, Professional and Unprofessional Relationships or documented failures to exercise sound leadership principles with respect to morale or welfare of subordinates and peers, leadership or customers.
- Never been convicted by a civilian court of Category 1, 2, or 3 offenses, nor exceeded the accepted number of Category 4 offenses. Category 3 and 4 minor traffic violations and similar infractions are not disqualifying.
 - NOTE: Categories of offenses are described and listed in AFI 36-2002, Regular Air Force and Special Category Accession, Uniform Guide List of Typical Offenses.
- No record of substance abuse, financial irresponsibility, domestic violence, or child abuse. Never been convicted by a general, special, or summary courts-martial.

Must maintain minimum grade of E-6.

Must maintain local network access IAW AFI 17-130, Cybersecurity Program Management and AFMAN 17-1
