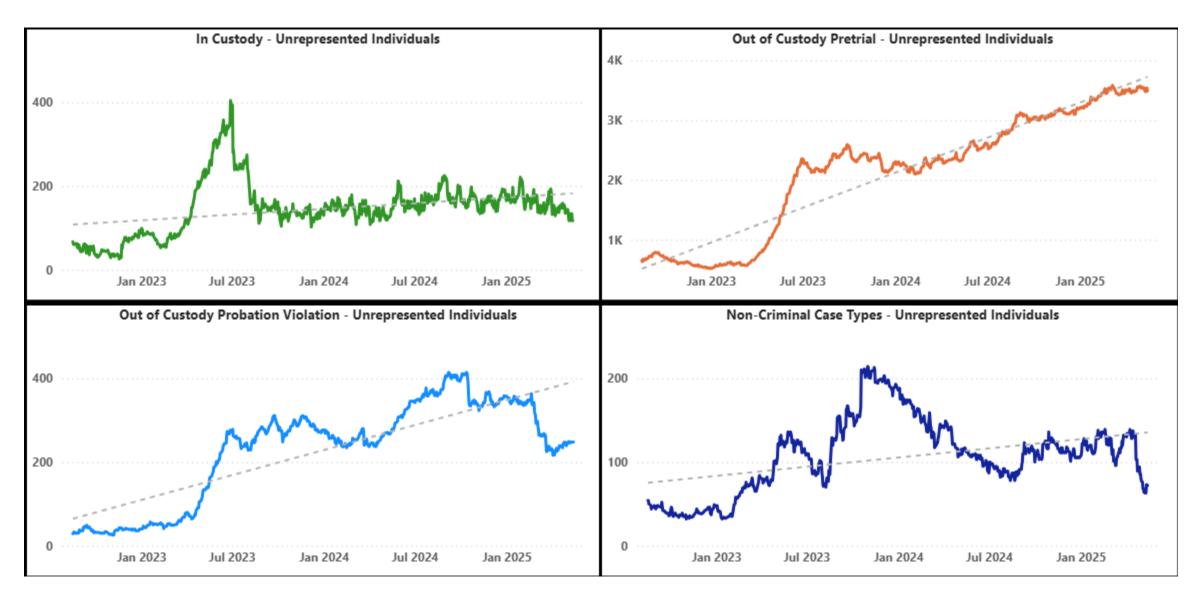

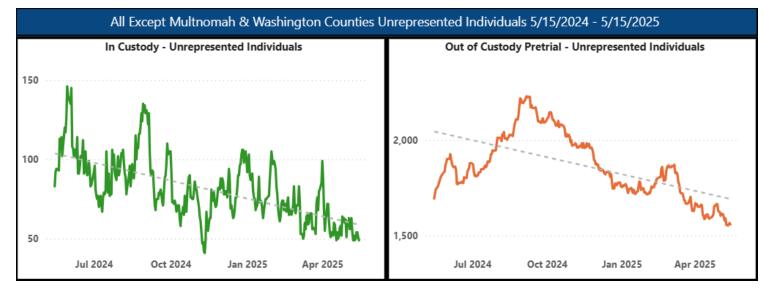


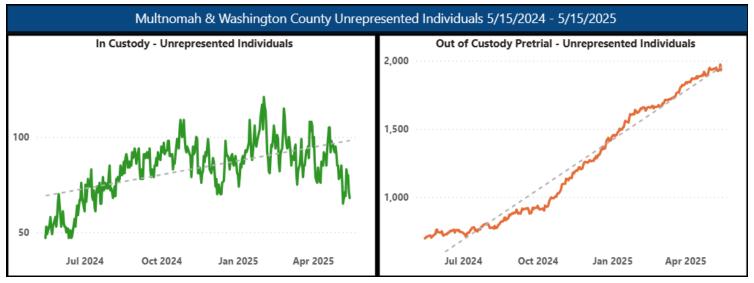
<u>Unrepresented Population Statewide Trends (8/1/22 – 5/15/25)</u>



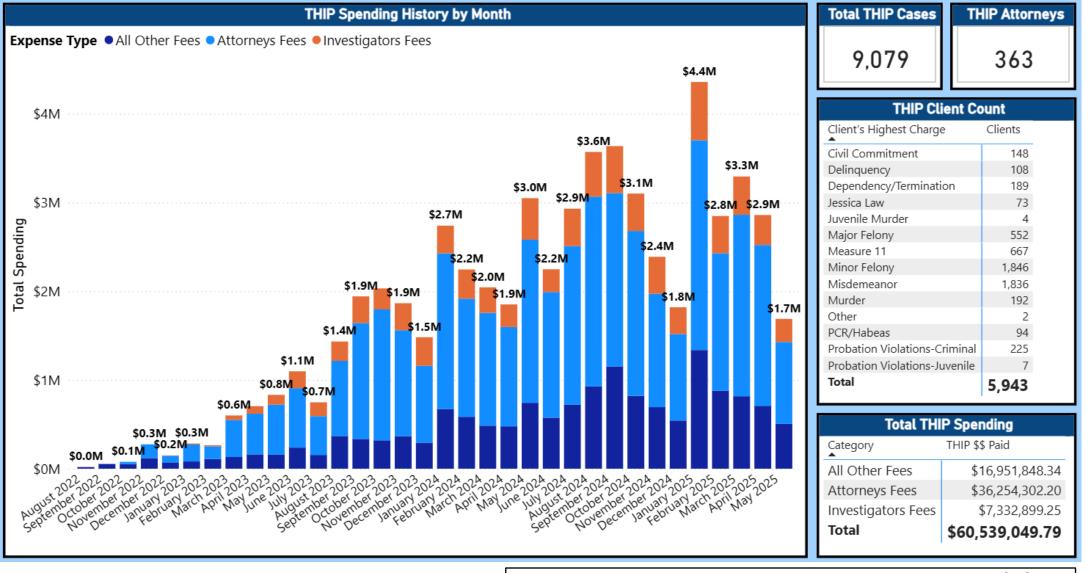
Unrepresented Population Trends

Over the past year, both in and out of custody unrepresented populations have been increasing in Multnomah and Washington county but decreasing overall in all other counties.



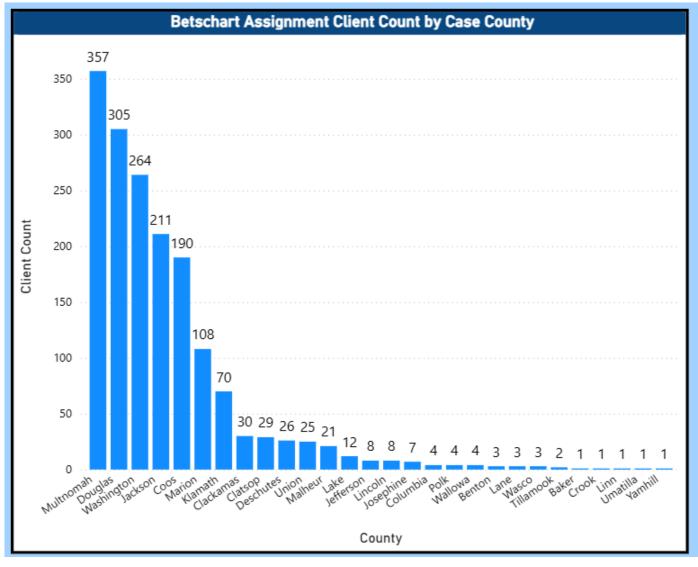


THIP Program Overview (8/1/22 – 5/16/25)

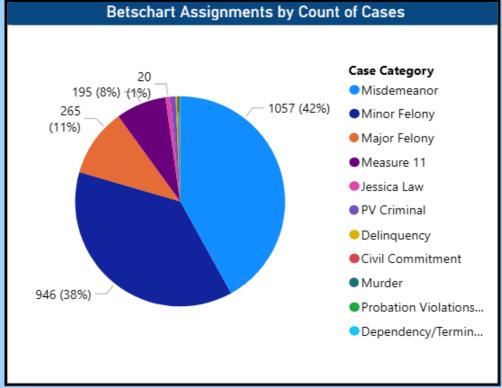

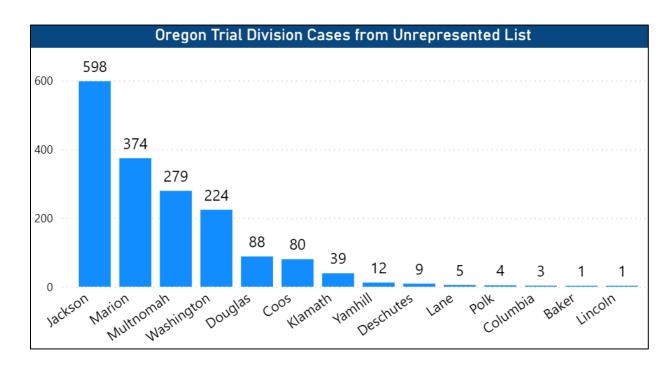

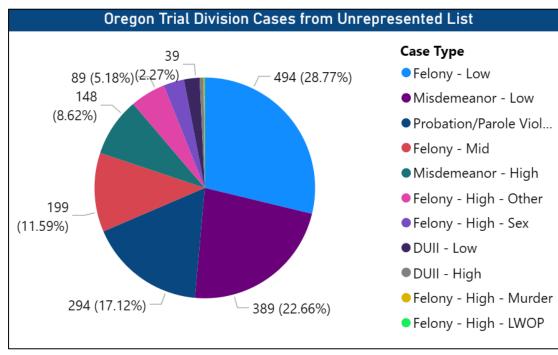

HB 2614

A-Engrossed (House Adopted)

- Continues sub-contracting until July 1, 2033, governance requirements for subcontractors;
- July 1, 2027 Commissioners and Executive Director may be removed for cause by Governor;
- Governor appoints Executive Director after consultation with Commissioners and confirmation by Senate;
- Replaces best practice language with constitutional requierments;
- Removes compensation language for contracts;
- Budget process through DAS;
- Removes advocacy language;
- Registry of attonreys.

-A10 (Senate Adopted)

- Continues sub-contracting until July 1, 2033, governance requirements for subcontractors;
- July 1, 2026 Commissioners and Executive Director may be removed for cause by Governor, or for reasons if more than 3;
- Governor provides Commission with 3 candidates for Director and Commission appoints;
- Replaces best practice language with constitutional requierments;
- Removes compensation language for contracts;
- Budget process through DAS;
- Removes advocacy language;
- Registry of attonreys.

OPDC is in regular communication with LFO and the Governor's office, working to finalize budget details.



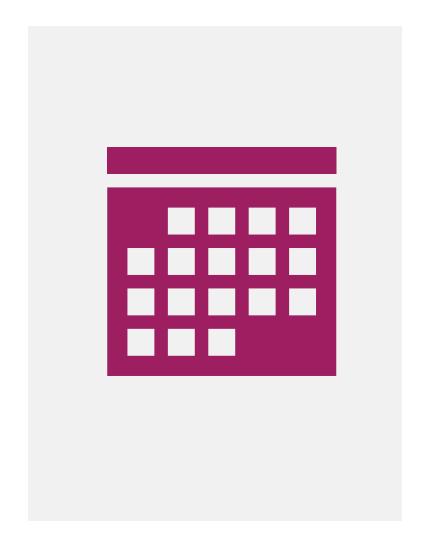
