Background:

The All-Terrain Vehicle Grant Subcommittee met May 18-19, 2023, in Salem and via Zoom to review 19 Law Enforcement (LE), one Planning, one Development and one Safety Education grant request, all totaling \$3,975,801.19. It is estimated that the ATV Grant program will receive at least \$11,505,890 in spending limitation for ATV grants for the 2023-2025 biennium.

The committee scored each grant request based on the applicant's presentation and application submitted. The scoring criteria were established in the 2016-2025 Oregon Statewide Trails Plan. The applications were ranked by the average of the scores given by the committee.

Requests for Law Enforcement funding were predominately from County Sheriff Offices, one request was received from US Forest Service (USFS). Grants are primarily comprised of salaries for officers to patrol and provide education about ATV rules and help keep riding areas safe. Sixteen of the applications are for ongoing programs which are currently funded this biennium. Eight programs are requesting funds for equipment, such as ATVs and side-by-sides. Staff also reached out to rural agencies, and received new applications from Wallowa, Wheeler and Jackson Counties.

Requests for **Planning**, **Development**, and **Safety Education** were received from Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Motorcycle Riders Association (Medford area) and Tread Lightly!, respectively.

The committee and staff recommend first funding the Law Enforcement grants in ranking order as funding is available, followed by Planning, Development, and Safety Education in ranking order as funding is available.

Prior Action by Commission: At the April 13, 2023 Commission Meeting, \$8,039,013.71 was recommended for approval for Operations and Maintenance funding.

Action Requested: Commission approval for the ranking and distribution of ATV grants as recommended by the ATV Grant Subcommittee and award funds as they are available.
