Topic: LGGP 2022 Large Grants Recommendation Emendation

Presented by: Michele Scalise, Grants and Community Programs Manager

In February 2022, staff provided the City of Nyssa with a Scoring Report for their Lions Park grant application that fell below the available funding cutoff in the 2022 grant cycle. The report included individual committee scores for each criterion as well as committee comments. Staff typically provides this report to applicants whose projects were not funded in order to analyze where improvement can be made in a future application.

After reviewing the report, the City requested further investigation into an individual committee member's score for their project proposal under the *Local Needs and Benefits* criteria. Staff agreed that a 2 out of 25 possible points appeared to be an anomaly based on the committee member's average scores in this category for the other applications.

Staff contacted the committee member and they were able to confirm that they had intended to enter 20, not 2 into the online scoring system. Had the intended score of 20 been entered rather than 2, Nyssa's proposal would have had an average score of 91.43 rather than 88.86, and would have ranked 24th rather than 26th.

In the 2022 grant cycle, funding was offered to projects ranked 1-25. Had the intended score been entered for Nyssa's project proposal it would have been ranked above the funding line rather than below. Additionally, the City of Sheridan received a score of 91.29 which placed them above the original funding line, consequently they received a \$558,000 park development grant. Chehalem Park Recreation District's original request was \$750,000. They were offered a partial award of the remaining grant funds available of \$176,875. They accepted the partial award and also were offered and accepted a \$562,125 Land and Water Conservation Fund grant.

All projects on the 2022 ranking list were deemed eligible for funding based on staff technical review prior to committee evaluation. The project proposals that were not selected for award were not funded due to the constraints of available funding during the 2022 grant cycle.

Action Requested: Staff seeks Commission approval to award the City of Nyssa their full 2022 grant request of \$719,600 in the first year of the 2023-25 biennium.
