

2019 HERITAGE SUMMIT SCHOLARSHIP

CULTURE OF BOARD ENGAGEMENT

OREGON HERITAGE

The 2019 Oregon Heritage Summit Scholarship provides financial assistance for Oregon heritage groups to send two or more representatives (at least one representative must be a board member) to attend the [Oregon Heritage Summit](#) in Medford, Oregon on April 25-26, 2019. The theme of the Summit is the “Culture of Board Engagement.” The Summit will cover strategies for moving board members through the “Board Cycle” recruiting, onboarding, engaged service, and thoughtful exit strategies. Scholarship funds will assist organizations to cover costs associated with sending multiple representatives to attend the Summit.

Scholarships will be reimbursable and offered on a first-come, first-served basis until the funds are expended. Scholarships will be offered to those organizations actively involved in local preservation efforts and who demonstrate in their application how attendance will impact their work.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION: Reimbursable awards will provide up to \$300 to heritage organizations who send two or more representatives (board and staff) to attend the Summit. Reimbursement checks will be issued to the organization; one scholarship per organization.

BUDGET INFORMATION: The scholarship may be used to cover costs associated with attending the Summit such as registration, lodging, transportation, and meals. Attendees must incur \$300 worth of costs to receive full scholarship.

REPORTING AND PAYMENT: Awarded scholarships will be the subjects of binding agreements between the State and the applicant organization. Scholarship funds are dispersed on a reimbursable basis. Details of payment arrangements and reporting will be provided at the time of award.

SCHOLARSHIP TIMELINE:

Deadline – until the funds are expended or April 15, 2019, whichever occurs first

Notification – A week after application is submitted

Reimbursement – Checks will be mailed the week after the Summit

Reporting Deadline – May 31, 2019

ELIGIBILITY:

- Must be Oregon residents at least 18 years of age.
- Two or more representatives from the same organization, at least one of whom is a board member, must attend the Summit. Reimbursement is based on attendance.
- One scholarship per organization.
- Must be active in local preservation efforts. This includes activities in historic preservation, archives, museums, Main Street, etc.
- Priority will be given to non-state employees.
