The Oregon Heritage MentorCorps started in 2014 as a statewide network of volunteers trained in the museum field and assist organizations with finding solutions, resources, and training volunteers and staff. In 2017, financial assistance was allotted through the Oregon Heritage MentorCorps to several regions of the state for technical assistance. This scholarship is available to assist heritage organizations in the central & southeastern region of the state, specifically organizations located in Grant, Harney, Malheur, Lake, Crook, Deschutes, Wheeler, and Jefferson County, to pay the registration fee (\$149) for a Connecting to Collections four-week long webinar course on Collections Management for Smaller Cultural Institutions (<https://www.connectingtocollections.org/course-collections-management/>). It is on a first come first serve basis with the completion and approval of an application to request the funds.

Application Information:

2. The following requirements need to be met in order to apply for this grant:
 - a. Must be located in one of the following counties: Grant, Harney, Malheur, Lake, Crook, Deschutes, Wheeler, and Jefferson.
 - b. An heritage organization that fits within one of the following categories:
 - Private nonprofit Oregon corporations
 - A local government within the state of Oregon
 - A tribal government of a Native American group recognized by the State of Oregon and the federal government and located in the State of Oregon
3. Organizations are limited to one scholarship that pays for one registration fee (\$149) for a Connecting to Collections four-week long webinar course on Collections Management for Smaller Cultural Institutions (<https://www.connectingtocollections.org/course-collections-management/>).

Grant Timeline:

- Applications can be submitted now until February 10, 2019
- Agreements for approved applicants must be signed by February 10, 2019.
- Funds for approved applications will be sent as soon as the two following conditions have been met:
 - Oregon Heritage has received a signed agreement
 - Oregon Heritage has received proof of registration for the above specified webinar series

Award Process:

Applications will be reviewed and approved in the order they are received until the funds are depleted or until Feb. 10, 2018, whichever occurs first. Approved applicants will be asked to sign an agreement and will receive the funds upon Oregon Heritage receiving the signed agreement and proof of registration for the above specified Connecting To Collections Collections Management for Smaller Cultural Institutions online course.
