STATE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION

This was added by the members of the State Historical Society to the draft sent to K. Commis. except for the last sentence. It is from former members of the Advisory Committee representing that part of the

The National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, Public Law 89-665 as amended, authorizes a program to expand the National Register of districts, sites, buildings, structures and objects significant in American history, architecture, archeology, and culture. The Act also authorizes a program of grants-in-aid to the states to assist in the preparation of comprehensive inventories and historic preservation plans; and the acquisition and development of qualified projects included in the plans. In order that Oregon may take full advantage of this significant federal Act and move with dedication and purpose to accomplish its purposes in our state.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND DIRECTED that the State Advisory Committee on Historic Preservation is created. The Committee is charged with reviewing the Statewide Inventory of Historic Sites and Buildings, approving nominations to the National Register of Historic Places from the State of Oregon, and commending approved nominations to the State Liaison Officer for Historic Preservation, all pursuant to and in accordance with the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, Public Law 89-665 as amended. The Committee shall also review and approve the Statewide Comprehensive Plan for Historic Preservation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND DIRECTED that the membership of the Committee shall include seven citizen members professionally recognized in the fields of history, architecture, archeology, and such other disciplines as may be appropriate. The Committee shall designate the Chairman. The members shall be appointed initially for terms in accordance with the following schedule:

- Three members for three-year terms
- Two members for two-year terms
- Two members for one-year terms

The balance of the Order is identical to the draft sent to the Commission

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND DIRECTED that members appointed subsequent to the initial appointments shall serve for terms of three years. Members appointed to fill vacancies shall serve for the remainder of the term of the vacating member. Members shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor and shall receive no compensation for their services, but, subject to laws governing travel and other expenses of State officers, are entitled to reimbursement for their actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND DIRECTED that the necessary secretarial and staff services for the Committee shall be performed by the State Liaison Officer for Historic Preservation. Expenses and services of the Committee shall be paid by the State Liaison Officer for Historic Preservation subject to the availability of funds therefor.
