

Oregon Heritage Programs Oregon State Historic Preservation Office 2010 Course Listing



Oregon Heritage Programs and the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) support local preservation efforts to identify, evaluate, preserve, and revitalize historic, archaeological, and cultural resources. Together, Heritage Programs and the SHPO offer courses, workshops, and training on a variety of heritage, history, and historic preservation topics. Courses include instruction in the National Register of Historic Places, training for archaeology researchers, historic window repair, cemetery preservation, grant planning and writing, historic resource surveys, interpretation, and museum collection management, among others.

All of our offerings are free and most are open to all preservation enthusiasts, including historic preservation professionals, students, local historic preservation commissions, planners, real estate professionals, owners of old or historic buildings, and interested community members. Courses are conducted by Heritage Programs and SHPO professionals and are designed to blend theoretical and technical knowledge with practical examples and guidance.

Course Descriptions

NR I National Register Primer: Introduction to the National Register and How to Apply the National Register Criteria for Evaluation

This course provides an introduction to the National Register of Historic Places program in Oregon, and how to evaluate the integrity of a property, evaluate a property within its historic context, and identify a property's type of significance using the National Register Criteria. This course is designed for the general public, historic review board members, preservation students and as a refresher for preservation professionals. Two sessions of this course are offered.

NR III Understanding and Writing National Register Multiple Property Submissions

Creating a Multiple Property Document is one of the most flexible ways to list thematically-related individual resources in the National Register as part of a Multiple Property Submission (MPS). Learn the specifics of the Multiple Property Document, its role within a MPS, and strategies for choosing a multiple property theme and writing registration requirements. This course is designed for preservation students and preservation professionals, but is open to all interested.

How to Register

- Go to <https://ilearn.oregon.gov> and login with an existing account or create a new account (click on “Create New Account”).
