## Public comments open on proposed changes to standardize dispute resolution rules

Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) is accepting public comments on proposed changes to update state rules governing collaborative dispute resolution and mediation.

The proposed changes update language to match existing Oregon Department of Justice (DOJ) model rules, as required by The Administrative Procedures Act (APA). A full copy of the proposed amendments is available on the <u>Proposed OPRD Rules web page</u>.

The APA requires state agencies to adopt rules of procedure in rulemaking, contested cases and other proceedings. It also directs the Oregon Attorney General to prepare model rules of procedure for state agencies. All of the proposed language must follow the model DOJ language and cannot be amended.

There is no scheduled public hearing at this time.
