# **Commission Landscape Overview**

### Federal and State Activities, Presented by Director

#### **State Service Plan Updates**

- The Governor has issued a notice regarding anticipated federal and state budget shortfalls.
- Due to current constraints, full 3-year planning is not feasible. Key challenges include:
  - Instability and legal uncertainty surrounding AmeriCorps funding
  - State budget shortfalls and travel restrictions
  - Limited capacity for engagement and in-person outreach

#### **Strategic Focus Areas**

- 1. Strengthen Impacts of Service
- 2. Engage Oregonians in Making a Difference

- 3. Foster Ready & Resilient Communities
- 4. Position the Commission as a Leader in Service
- 5. Increase Service Involvement of Older Adults

#### **Initiatives to Strengthen Impacts of Service**

- Expand marketing and outreach through career centers and schools
- Provide recruitment support to grantees
- Implement grantmaking changes to reduce barriers

#### **HECC Strategic Plan Connections**

- Relevance: National service prepares participants for civic and workforce leadership
- Alignment: Service-to-career pathways (e.g., NGA, Climate Corps, Youth Mental Health Corps)
- Affordable Access: AmeriCorps Education Award reduces financial barriers
- Belonging: DEIA-driven service model fosters inclusion
- Leadership: Service pathways advance Oregon's economic and workforce goals

## **Federal & State Policy Landscape Overview**

## Presented by Kaira Esgate, America's Service Commissions (ASC)

#### America's State Service Commission (ASC) Overview

- ASC is the national membership association representing all 52 state and territorial service commissions.
- Several members of AmeriCorps agency leadership have served on the ASC Board.

## **ASC Strategic Goals**

- 1. Commission and Program Building Capacity
- 2. Public Policy
  - Maintain federal funding at \$27 million annually
  - Increase the number of state service commissions receiving funding from 37 to 40 by July 1, 2027
- 3. National Service Ecosystem
- 4. Financial Model
  - Grow annual ASC income from \$3.2 million in 2024 to \$4.4 million by
     2027
  - Strengthening financial systems for tracking and utilizing funds
- 5. Human and Operational Resources

#### **FY26 Appropriations**

- President's Budget Proposal
  - \$1.7 trillion overall for discretionary spending.

- Represents a 22.6% (\$163 billion) reduction in non-defense discretionary (NDD) accounts compared to FY25.
- House Appropriations Committee Allocations
  - Committee released allocations spending \$150 billion more on NDD than the President's budget.
  - House GOP plan sets NDD at \$705.6 billion, which is \$14.9 billion lower than the enacted FY25 level of \$720.5 billion.
- Legislative Outlook
  - Anticipated to be a difficult appropriations cycle due to budget constraints, impoundment, and rescissions.
  - Passage of bills expected to be challenging in the House and impossible in the Senate.
- Labor, Health and Human Services (LHHS) Bill
  - Approved by House Appropriations Committee.
  - o Provides \$184.5 billion overall, a \$13.7 billion (7%) reduction from FY25.
  - Allocates \$643 million for the AmeriCorps agency.
  - o Legislation renames AmeriCorps as "Ameria First Corps."
