

REFERENCE WAIVER MATRIX

Engineers:

Pursuant to OAR 820-010-1000(4)(f), applicants are required to provide five total references. Three of those five references must be from active PE registrants in the applicant's jurisdiction. All work experience, must be verified by at least one reference, with active PE registration in the applicant's jurisdiction, and who had direct supervision of the applicant's work. However, if applicant has been registered as a PE in his or her jurisdiction for at least six years, the "supervisory" reference may simply have held active PE registration at the time the work was performed, and be familiar with that work. An applicant who cannot meet the reference requirements of OAR 820-010-1000(4)(f)(B) through (D), may apply to the Board for a reference waiver under OAR 820-010-1000(4)(f)(E).

Land Surveyors:

Pursuant to OAR 820-010-2000(5)(f), applicants are required to provide five total references. Three of those five references must be from active PLS registrants in the applicant's jurisdiction. All work experience must be verified by at least one reference with active PLS registration in the applicant's jurisdiction, and who had direct supervision of the applicant's experience. However, if applicant has been registered as a PLS in his or her jurisdiction for at least six years, the "supervisory" reference may simply have held active PLS registration at the time the work was performed, and be familiar with that work.

An applicant who cannot meet the reference requirements of OAR 820-010-2000(5)(f)(B) through (D), may apply to the Board for a reference waiver under OAR 820-010-2000(5)(f)(E).

Structural Engineers:

Pursuant to OAR 820-010-4000(4)(e)(A) and (B), applicants are required to provide five total references with knowledge of the applicant's *structural* engineering work, on *significant structures**.

Three of those five references must hold Structural Engineer registration in an NCEES jurisdiction. However, an applicant who cannot meet the reference requirements of OAR 820-010-1000(4)(e)(A) and (B), may apply to the Board for a reference waiver under OAR 820-010-4000(4)(f)(C).

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The Board **may** grant a reference waiver under the following circumstances, but a waiver is **not** guaranteed:
