**FINAL ORDER INCORPORATING
SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

Based on the attached Settlement Agreement, incorporated herein, the Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying (Board) finds that Jack Camp (Camp) violated Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 672.200(5), Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) 820-020-0025(1) and 820-020-0045(3). IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that pursuant to ORS 672.200(5) and (6), and OAR 820-020-0015(3), the Board hereby revokes Camp's professional engineer registration 82904PE for these violations. However, IT IS ALSO HEREBY ORDERED that such revocation shall be held in abeyance for one year from the date this final order is issued, revocation of Camp's professional engineer registration to be dismissed after one year if and only if Camp fully complies with all terms of the attached settlement agreement within that time period. If Camp fails to fully comply with all terms of the attached settlement agreement within one year from the date this final order is issued, the revocation of his professional engineer registration 82904PE shall become immediately effective.

2 **SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

3 The Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying (Board), by
4 and through its President, Jason Kent, and Jack Camp (Camp), do hereby agree to settle this
5 matter in accordance with ORS 183.417(3). At all relevant times, Camp was an Oregon
6 registered professional engineer, number 82904PE.
7

8 On July 27, 2016, the Board issued a Notice of Intent to suspend Camp’s registration for
9 two years. The Board charged Camp with violations of OAR 820-020-0025(1) and 820-020-
10 0045(3), and ORS 672.200(5), for his actions in Texas, which would have been Oregon
11 violations had they occurred here, including failing to comply with a board order, failing to pay a
12 civil penalty assessed by the board, and making an untruthful statement. Camp timely requested
13 an informal conference on the matter. On February 9, 2017, the Board and Camp agreed to settle
14 the matter, therefore no hearing is required.

16 The Board finds and Camp admits to the following:

17 1.

18 At all relevant times, Camp was an Oregon Professional Engineer, registration number
19 82904PE.

22 Camp failed to pay Texas Board of Professional Engineers (“Texas Board”) a civil
23 penalty of \$4,000 that the Texas Board assessed, and which was due July 29, 2015. This failure
24 would also have been a violation of the Board's statutes and rules had it occurred in Oregon, as
25 Oregon registrants have an obligation to pay civil penalties assessed by the Board, and also have
26 an obligation not to engage in unprofessional behaviors, including that registrants must make

1 timely and full payment to the Board of all Board assessed fees, fines and penalties ORS
2 672.200(5) and OAR 820-020-0045(3).

3 3.

4 Camp falsely certified to the Texas Board on his 2014 Texas professional engineer
5 license renewal application that he had completed the required 15 hours of continuing education
6 when he had not done so. This conduct would also have been a violation of the Board's rules of
7 professional conduct had it occurred in Oregon, as Oregon registrants are required to issue
8 statements only in a truthful manner OAR 820-020-0025(1).

9 4.

10 Camp's Texas professional engineer license was ultimately suspended for the
11 conduct above.

12 5.

13 Therefore, the conduct described above is the basis for discipline against registration
14 pursuant to OAR 820-020-0015(3) and ORS 672.200(5) and (6), and Camp's registration shall
15 be revoked. However, revocation of Camp's registration shall be held in abeyance for one year
16 from the date the Final Order accompanying this settlement agreement is issued.

17 6.

18 If Camp pays the Texas Board the \$4,000 civil penalty he owes to it, and provides the
19 Board with written confirmation from the Texas Board that Camp has paid the civil penalty in
20 full, within one year from the date the Final Order accompanying this settlement agreement is
21 issued, Camp's revocation shall be dismissed. If, however, Camp fails within a year from the
22 date the Final Order accompanying this settlement agreement is issued to complete payment of
23 the full civil penalty to the Texas Board and provide the Board with written confirmation thereof,
24 from the Texas Board, Camp's revocation shall be effective immediately.




