1.	Former OAR 820-020-0045(4) (2006), a rule of professional conduct, provided that an
	applicant or registrant must give written notification to the Board of any disciplinary action
	or sanction related to the practice of engineering, land surveying, or photogrammetric
	mapping imposed by any licensing agency immediately upon receiving notice of the action
	or sanction. ¹
2.	Under ORS 672.325(1), the Board may impose a civil penalty of up to \$1,000 per violation.
	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
1.	Because the Missouri Settlement Agreement placing Hasan's PE license on probation is a
	disciplinary action or sanction related to the practice of engineering, Hasan was required to
	report it.
2.	Because the Missouri Settlement Agreement was entered on January 4, 2016, former OAR
	820-020-0045(4) (2006) applied.
3.	Because Hasan did not report his Missouri PE license discipline to the Board immediately, he
	violated former OAR 820-020-0045(4) (2006).
4.	The conduct described above is the basis for discipline under ORS 672.325. Pursuant to
	672.325(1), the Agency may impose a maximum civil penalty of \$1,000 per violation.
