GUY NELSON FINAL ORDER BY DEFAULT

On or about April 22, 2021, the Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying (Board) properly served a Notice of Intent to Assess a Civil Penalty (Notice) on Guy Nelson (Nelson). The Notice proposed to assess a civil penalty in the amount of \$500. It designated the Board file on this matter as the record for purposes of establishing a *prima facie* case upon default. Nelson did not request a hearing. Therefore, upon consideration of the facts and law, the Board enters the following Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT AND ULTIMATE FACTS

- 1. At all relevant times, Nelson was a licensed engineer, registration number 83338PE. Nelson applied for renewal of his license on February 5, 2021. Nelson answered "yes" to a question on the renewal application relating to being disciplined within the prior two years. The Board has not renewed Nelson's license pending an investigation.
- 2. The investigation disclosed that on or about November 9, 2015, the Indiana State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers (Indiana Board) issued a Notice of Immediate Suspension against Nelson for failing to comply with a Notice of Noncompliance, which was issued against him on September 23, 2015 for his failure to comply with a continuing education audit.
- 3. A Notice of Immediate Suspension is a disciplinary action related to the practice of engineering.

1	4.	Nelson did not report the Indiana Notice of Immediate Suspension to the Oregon Board.
2		APPLICABLE LAW
3	1.	Former OAR 820-020-0045(4) (2006), a rule of professional conduct, provided that an
4		applicant or registrant must give written notification to the Board of any disciplinary action
5		or sanction related to the practice of engineering, land surveying, or photogrammetric
6		mapping imposed by any licensing agency immediately upon receiving notice of the action
7		or sanction. 1
8	2.	Under ORS 670.325(1), the Board may impose a civil penalty of up to \$1,000 per violation
10		of its laws and rules.
11	3.	Under ORS 672.200(6), the Board may suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue, restore, or renew
12		a certificate or permit, or may reprimand an individual enrolled as an intern or holding a
13		certificate or permit for violating a rule of professional conduct prescribed by the board.
14		CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
15	1.	Because the Indiana Notice of Immediate Suspension is disciplinary action related to the
1617		practice of engineering, Nelson was required to report it to the Board immediately upon
18		receiving notice of the sanction.
19	2.	Because the Indiana Notice of Immediate Suspension was entered by the Indiana Board on or
20		about November 9, 2015, former OAR 820-020-0045(4) (2006) applied at the time and
21		required Nelson to report disciplinary action in other states to the Oregon Board immediately
22		upon receiving notice of that action.

24		ffective May 9, 2019, OAR 820-020-0045(4) currently reads: "An applicant or registrant must give written ification to the Board of any disciplinary action or sanction related to the practice of engineering, land surveying,
25	or p	photogrammetric mapping imposed by any licensing agency within 45- days of the final order being issued."
26	Had	d Nelson been subject to the current rule, he would still be in violation because more than 45 days passed without

him having reported the Indiana discipline.

1	3. Because Nelson failed to report the Indiana Notice of Immediate Suspension to the Oregon
2	Board immediately upon receiving notice of that action, Nelson violated former OAR 820-
3	020-0045(4) (2006).
4	4. The conduct described above is the basis for disciplinary sanctions under ORS 672.325(1)
5	and ORS 672.200(6). Nelson's failure to immediately report the Indiana Notice of Immediate
6	Suspension to the Oregon Board is a basis to assess a civil penalty of \$500 for Nelson's
7	violation of former OAR 820-020-0045(4) (2006) detailed above.
8	ORDER
10	For the reasons above, the Board HEREBY assesses a civil penalty in the amount of
11	\$500 against Nelson for violating former OAR 820-020-0045(4) (2006).
