FINAL ORDER BY DEFAULT

On or about March 7, 2024, the Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying (Board) properly served a Notice of Intent to Assess a Civil Penalty (Notice) on Larry Maddux (Maddux) via certified mail. The Notice proposed to assess a civil penalty in the amount of \$7,000. It designated the Board file on this matter as the record for purposes of establishing a prima facie case upon default. Maddux did not request a hearing. Therefore, upon consideration of the facts and law, the Board enters the following Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT AND ULTIMATE FACTS

- 1. Maddux became an Oregon Professional Land Surveyor, registration number 02430PLS, on January 23, 1990. Maddux's license expired on December 31, 2020 due to Maddux's failure to renew, and it is currently in delinquent status.
- 2. On or around February 1, 2021, Maddux prepared Exhibit C of City of Medford Ordinance No. 2021-102, on which his stamp bore the false expiration date of December 31, 2021 (Project 1).
- 3. On or around September 22, 2022, Maddux prepared Exhibit B of Medford or Bust LLC Public Utility Easement #7833, on which his stamp bore the false expiration date of December 31, 2023 (Project 2).
- 4. On or around December 12, 2022, Maddux prepared Medford or Bust LLC Site Plan for Lot Consolidation, on which his stamp bore the false expiration date of December 31, 2023 (Project 3).

5. On or around December 12, 2022, Maddux prepared Exhibit B for Medford or Bust LLC 1 Public Utility Easement #7834, on which his stamp bore the false expiration date of 2 3 December 31, 2023 (Project 4). 4 6. On or around April 10, 2023 and May 5, 2023, Maddux prepared Joe M. Westermann Map of 5 Survey for Property Line Adjustment, on which his stamp bore the false expiration date of 6 December 31, 2024 (Project 5). 7. On or around June 2023, Maddux prepared Exhibit A of Medford or Bust LLC Public Utility Easement #7833, on which his stamp bore the false expiration date of June 1, 2023 (Project 9 6). 10 11 8. On or around June 2023, Maddux prepared Exhibit A of Medford or Bust LLC Public Utility 12 Easement #7834, on which his stamp bore the false expiration date of June 1, 2023 (Project 13 7). 14 9. Preparing exhibits for public ordinances, exhibits for public utility easements, site plans for 15 lot consolidations, and surveys for property line adjustments all constitute the practice of land 16 surveying. 17 APPLICABLE LAW 18 19 1. ORS 672.005(2) provides, in pertinent part, that the "practice of land surveying" means 20 providing or offering to provide for others professional services that apply mathematics, 21 geodesy and other sciences and involve the making of geometric measurements and 22 gathering of related information pertaining to the physical or legal features of the earth: 23 improvements on the earth; or the space above or below the earth. 24 /// 25 /// 26

- 2. ORS 672.025(1) provides that no person shall practice land surveying in this state unless the person is registered and has a valid certificate to practice land surveying issued under ORS 672.002 to 672.325.
- 4 3. ORS 672.045(4) provides that a person may not attempt to use an expired or revoked certificate or permit.
- 4. Under ORS 670.325(1), the Board may impose a civil penalty of up to \$1,000 per violation of its laws and rules.
- 5. OAR 820-015-0060 provides that, in establishing the amount of a civil penalty to be assessed g pursuant ORS 672.325, the Board may consider the following factors: (a) the nature, gravity 10 11 and magnitude of the violation; (b) prior violations, including administrative, civil or 12 criminal proceedings in any state; (c) whether the violation was repeated or continuous; (d) 13 whether the violation was an inadvertent act or an intentional act; (e) the history of the 14 respondent in taking steps necessary or appropriate to correct any violation; (f) the 15 opportunity for and the difficulty in correcting the violation at issue; and (g) whether 16 measures have been put in place to prevent reoccurrence. In considering the factors set forth 17 above, the applicable factors may be given varying weight depending upon the circumstances 18 19 of the violation.
- 20 6. Under ORS 672.200(6), the Board may suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue, restore, or renew
 21 a certificate or permit, or may reprimand an individual enrolled as an intern or holding a
 22 certificate or permit for violating a rule of professional conduct prescribed by the board.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Because Projects 1-7 are each a product of professional services provided for others that apply mathematics, geodesy and other sciences, and involve the making of geometric

measurements and gathering of related information pertaining to the physical or legal 1 features of the earth; improvements on the earth; or the space above or below the earth, they 2 3 are each a product of professional land surveying as provided by ORS 672,005(2). 4 2. Because Maddux prepared Projects 1-7 while Maddux's Oregon Professional Land Surveyor 5 registration was expired and in delinquent status, Maddux's certificate to practice land 6 surveying was not valid, and Maddux therefore violated ORS 672.025(1) on seven separate 7 occasions. 3. Because Maddux applied false expiration dates to his stamp when he prepared each of the Projects 1-7 as described above—all while Maddux's Oregon Professional Land Surveyor 10 11 registration was expired and in delinquent status—Maddux attempted to use an expired 12 certificate on seven separate occasions, and he therefore violated ORS 672.045(4) on seven 13 occasions. 14 The conduct described above is the basis for discipline under ORS 672.325(1) and ORS 15 672.200(6). Pursuant to ORS 672.200(6), the Board may suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue, 16 restore, or renew a certificate or permit, or may reprimand an individual holding a certificate 17 or permit for violating a rule of professional conduct prescribed by the board without 18 19 amending its notice. 20 /// 21 /// 22 /// 23 /// 24 /// 25 /// 26

1	ORDER
2	For the reasons above, the Board assesses a civil penalty against Maddux in the
3	amount of \$1,000 for each of the projects above for a total of \$7,000 for violating ORS
4	672.025(1) and ORS 672.045(4). Each penalty is independently enforceable in case of a
5	remand reversing any of the other civil penalties imposed.
