6	On or about February 15, 2024, the Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering		
7	and Land Surveying (Board) properly served a Notice of Intent to Assess a Civil Penalty		
8	(Notice) on Barrett Crook (Crook). The Notice assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,000		
9	and it designated the Board file on this matter as the record for purposes of establishing a prime		
10	facie case upon default. Crook returned the response options form, the full payment of the civi		
11	penalty, indicated he did not wish to contest the findings and did not request a hearing.		
12	Therefore, upon consideration of the facts and law, the Board enters the following Order:		
13	FINDINGS	S OF FACT AND ULTIMATE FACTS	
14	1. At all relevant times, Crook	k was an Oregon Professional Engineer (PE), registration	
15	number 94789PE.		
16	2. On or about December 6, 2	2023, Crook submitted an application for renewal of his PE	
17	license to the Oregon Boar	d of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying.	
18	3. On the renewal application	a, Crook indicated that he had received professional license	
19	discipline in another jurisd	iction and received a Consent Order from the North Carolina	
20	Board of Examiners for En	ngineers and Land Surveyors (North Carolina Board) on April	
21	13, 2022.

4. Crook did not report the North Carolina Board discipline to OSBEELS until December 6. 2023, 602 days after he was disciplined by the North Carolina Board. APPLICABLE LAW 1. Under ORS 672.325(1), the Board may impose a civil penalty of up to \$1,000 per violation without amending its notice. 2. Under OAR 820-020-0045(4) An applicant or registrant must give written notification to the Board of any disciplinary action or sanction related to the practice of engineering, land surveying, or photogrammetric mapping imposed by any licensing agency within 45-days of the final order being issued. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW 1. Because Crook did not report his discipline to the Board until December 6, 2023, even though the consent order was entered into on April 13, 2022, Crook failed to report the North Carolina Board action taken against him to the Oregon Board within 45 days, thus violating OAR 820-020-0045(4). 2. The conduct described above is the basis for discipline under ORS 672.325. Pursuant to 672.325(1), the Board may impose a maximum civil penalty of \$1,000 per violation. ///
