Change Advisory: Update to Division 31 of the Nurse Practice Act

Summary

Chapter 851 Division 31 of Oregon's Nurse Practice Act (NPA) is updated as of March 1, 2025. Division 31 Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) contains standards on licensure as a registered nurse (RN) and as a licensed practical nurse (LPN).

Changes made to Division 31 align the rules with current Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS), remove barriers to licensure, and maintain public safety. Substantive changes are identified below

Impact

Changes lessen barriers for persons applying for licensure as an RN, RN-Emeritus (E), LPN, LPN-E; persons applying for retired status; and for RNs seeking placement on the Board's Registered Nurse First Assistant Registry.

Removes requirement of 10,000 lifetime practice hours, accrual of 400 practice hours in previous two years and submission of a continued competency plan to the Board. Replaces with two hours of cultural competency CE within two years immediately preceding application; one hour of pain management CE within 36 months immediately preceding application; attestation to 12 hours of nursing CE in the last 12 months; and a completed application.
